penalties, a permanent injunction, and other equitable relief for defendant's violation of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a), and the FTC's Telemarketing Sales Rule (the "TSR" or "Rule"), 16 C.F.R. Part 310, as amended by 68 Fed. Reg. 4580, 4669 (January 29, 2003).

JURISDICTION AND VENUE

- 2. This Court has subject matter jurisdiction over this action pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1331, 1337(a), 1345, and 1355, and 15 U.S.C. §§ 45(m)(1)(A), 53(b), 56(a) and 57b. This action arises under 15 U.S.C. § 45(a).
- 3. Venue is proper in this District under 28 U.S.C. §§ 1391(b)-(c) and 1395(a), and 15 U.S.C. § 53(b).

DEFENDANT

4. Defendant Ameriquest Mortgage Company ("Ameriquest") is a Delaware corporation with its principal place of business at 1100 Town and Country Road, Orange, California 92868. Ameriquest is a mortgage lender that initiates outbound telephone calls to induce consumers to refinance their mortgages. Ameriquest transacts or has transacted business in this District.

THE TELEMARKETING SALES RULE AND THE NATIONAL DO NOT CALL REGISTRY

5. Congress directed the FTC to prescribe rules prohibiting abusive and deceptive telemarketing acts or practices pursuant to the Telemarketing Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 6101-6108. On August 16, 1995, the FTC adopted the Telemarketing Sales Rule (the "Original TSR"), 16 C.F.R. Part 310, which became effective on December 31, 1995. On January 29, 2003, the FTC amended the TSR by issuing a Statement of Basis and Purpose ("SBP") and the final amended TSR (the "Amended TSR"). 68 Fed. Reg. 4580, 4669.

- Among other things, the Amended TSR established a "do-not-call" registry, 6. maintained by the Commission (the "National Do Not Call Registry" or "Registry"), of consumers who do not wish to receive certain types of telemarketing calls. Consumers can register their telephone numbers on the Registry without charge either through a toll-free telephone call or over the Internet at donotcall.gov.
- Consumers who receive telemarketing calls to their registered numbers can 7. complain of Registry violations the same way they registered, through a toll-free telephone call or over the Internet at <u>donotcall.gov</u>, or by otherwise contacting law enforcement authorities.
- Since October 17, 2003, sellers and telemarketers have been prohibited from 8. calling numbers on the Registry in violation of the Amended TSR, 16 C.F.R. § 310.4(b)(1)(iii)(B).
- Since December 31, 1995, sellers and telemarketers have been prohibited 9. from initiating an outbound telephone call to any person when that person previously has stated that he or she does not wish to receive an outbound telephone call made by or on behalf of the seller whose goods or services are being offered. 16 C.F.R. § 310.4(b)(1)(iii)(A).
- Since September 2, 2003, sellers, telemarketers, and other permitted 10. organizations have been able to access the Registry over the Internet at telemarketing.donotcall.gov to download the registered numbers.
- Pursuant to Section 3(c) of the Telemarketing Act, 15 U.S.C. § 6102(c), and 11. Section 18(d)(3) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 57a(d)(3), a violation of the TSR constitutes an unfair or deceptive act or practice in or affecting commerce, in violation of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a).

- 12. Defendant is a "seller" and a "telemarketer" engaged in "telemarketing," as defined by the Amended TSR, 16 C.F.R. § 310.2.
- 13. Defendant has engaged in telemarketing by a plan, program, or campaign conducted to induce the purchase of goods or services by use of one or more telephones and which involves more than one interstate telephone call.
- 14. On or after October 17, 2003, Defendant has called consumers' telephone numbers that are on the National Do Not Call Registry.
- 15. On or after December 31, 1995, Defendant has called consumers who have previously stated that they do not wish to receive calls made by or on behalf of Defendant.
- 16. At all times relevant to this Complaint, Defendant has maintained a substantial course of trade or business in the offering for sale and sale of goods or services via the telephone, in or affecting commerce, as "commerce" is defined in Section 4 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 44.

VIOLATIONS OF THE TELEMARKETING SALES RULE Count I

Count I (Violating the National Do Not Call Registry)

- In numerous instances, in connection with telemarketing, Defendant has engaged in initiating an outbound telephone call to a person's telephone number on the National Do Not Call Registry in violation of the TSR, 16 C.F.R. § 310.4(b)(1)(iii)(B).
 - Count II (Ignoring Entity-Specific Do Not Call Requests)
- 18. In numerous instances, in connection with telemarketing, Defendant has engaged in initiating an outbound telephone call to a person who has previously stated that he or she does not wish to receive such a call made by

or on behalf of the seller whose goods or services are being offered, in violation of the TSR, 16 C.F.R. § 310.4(b)(1)(iii)(A).

CONSUMER INJURY

19. Consumers in the United States have suffered and will suffer injury as a result of Defendant's violations of the TSR. Absent injunctive relief by this Court, Defendant is likely to continue to injure consumers and harm the public interest.

THIS COURT'S POWER TO GRANT RELIEF

- Section 13(b) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 53(b), empowers this Court to 20. grant injunctive and other ancillary relief to prevent and remedy any violation of any provision of law enforced by the FTC.
- Section 5(m)(1)(A) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(m)(1)(A), as modified 21. by Section 4 of the Federal Civil Penalties Inflation Adjustment Act of 1990, 28 U.S.C. § 2461, as amended, and as implemented by 16 C.F.R. § 1.98(d) (1997), authorizes this Court to award monetary civil penalties of not more than \$11,000 for each violation of the TSR. Defendant's violations of the TSR were committed with the knowledge required by Section 5(m)(1)(A) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(m)(1)(A).
- This Court, in the exercise of its equitable jurisdiction, may award ancillary 22. relief to remedy injury caused by Defendant's violations of the Rule and the FTC Act.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Plaintiff requests that this Court, as authorized by Sections 5(a), 5(m)(1)(A), and 13(b) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 45(a), 45(m)(1)(A), and 53(b), and pursuant to its own equitable powers:

1	1.	Enter judgment against Defendant and in favor of Plaintiff for each
2		violation alleged in this Complaint;
3	2.	Award Plaintiff monetary civil penalties from Defendant for every violation
4		of the TSR;
5	3.	Permanently enjoin Defendant from violating the TSR and the FTC Act;
6	4.	Award such relief as the Court finds necessary to redress injury to
7		consumers resulting from Defendant's violations of the Rule, including but
8	:	not limited to, rescission of contracts, refund of monies paid, and
9		disgorgement of ill-gotten gains;
10	5.	Order Defendant to pay the costs of this action; and
11	6.	Award Plaintiff such other and additional relief as the Court may determine
12		to be just and proper.
