23 Plaintiff, the Federal Trade Commission (“Commission” or “FTC”), filed its
24 Complaint for Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief (“Complaint”), pursuant to
25 Section 13(b) of the Federal Trade Commission Act (“FTC Act”), 15 U.S.C. § 53(b) (Doc. No.
26 2), and has moved, pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b), for a preliminary injunction to issue against
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1 Golden Sunrise Nutraceutical, Inc., Golden Sunrise Pharmaceutical, Inc., Huu Tieu, and Stephen
2 Meis.

3 **THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** as follows:

4 **FINDINGS OF FACT**

5 A. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, and there is good
6 cause to believe that it will have jurisdiction over all parties hereto and that venue in this district
7 is proper.

8 B. This Court has authority to enter a preliminary injunction pursuant to FED. R. CIV.
9 P. 65.

10 C. The Complaint charges that Stipulating Defendants and Defendant Meis
11 participated in deceptive acts or practices in violation of Sections 5 and 12 of the FTC Act, 15
12 U.S.C., §§ 45 and 52, in connection with the sale of dietary supplements.

13 D. Stipulating Defendants neither admit nor deny any of the allegations in the
14 Complaint related to Stipulating Defendants, except as specifically stated in this Order. Only for
15 purposes of this action, Stipulating Defendants admit the facts necessary to establish jurisdiction.

16 E. Stipulating Defendants waive any claim that he may have under the Equal Access
17 to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412, concerning the prosecution of this action through the date of
18 this Order, and agrees to bear his own costs and attorney fees.

19 F. Stipulating Defendants waive all rights to appeal or otherwise challenge or contest
20 the validity of this Order.

21 G. This Court has authority to issue this Order pursuant to Section 13(b) of the FTC
22 Act, 15 U.S.C. § 53(b); Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65; and the All Writs Act, 28 U.S.C.
23 § 1651.

1 H. No security is required of any agency of the United States for issuance of a
2 preliminary injunction. FED. R. CIV. P. 65(c).

3 **DEFINITIONS**

4 For purposes of this Order, the following definitions apply:

5 A. “**Asset**” means any legal or equitable interest in, right to, or claim to, any
6 property, wherever located and by whomever held.

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8 B. “**Covered Product**” means any Food, Drug, Dietary Supplement, or any Plan of
9 Care or any ingredient included in a Plan of Care, with “Plan of Care” meaning the products and
10 services Defendants have marketed as the “Primary Plan of Care,” the “Emergency D-Virus Plan
11 of Care,” the “Metabolic Plan of Care,” and the “Cancer Plan of Care.”

12 C. “**Dietary Supplement**” means:

- 13 1. any product labeled as a dietary supplement or otherwise represented as a dietary
14 supplement; or
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16 2. any pill, tablet, capsule, powder, softgel, gelcap, liquid, or other similar form
17 containing one or more ingredients that are a vitamin, mineral, herb or other
18 botanical, amino acid, probiotic, or other dietary substance for use by humans to
19 supplement the diet by increasing the total dietary intake, or a concentrate,
20 metabolite, constituent, extract, or combination of any ingredient described above,
21 that is intended to be ingested, and is not represented to be used as a conventional
22 food or as a sole item of a meal or the diet.

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24 D. “**Document**” is synonymous in meaning and equal in scope to the usage of
25 “document” and “electronically stored information” in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 34(a),
26 FED. R. CIV. P. 34(a), and includes writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, sound and
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1 video recordings, images, Internet sites, web pages, websites, electronic correspondence,
2 including e-mail and instant messages, contracts, accounting data, advertisements, FTP Logs,
3 Server Access Logs, books, written or printed records, handwritten notes, telephone logs,
4 telephone scripts, receipt books, ledgers, personal and business canceled checks and check
5 registers, bank statements, appointment books, computer records, customer or sales databases
6 and any other electronically stored information, including Documents located on remote servers
7 or cloud computing systems, and other data or data compilations from which information can be
8 obtained directly or, if necessary, after translation into a reasonably usable form. A draft or non-
9 identical copy is a separate document within the meaning of the term.

11 E. “**Drug**” means: (1) articles recognized in the official United States
12 Pharmacopoeia, official Homoeopathic Pharmacopoeia of the United States, or official National
13 Formulary, or any supplement to any of them; (2) articles intended for use in the diagnosis, cure,
14 mitigation, treatment, or prevention of disease in humans or other animals; (3) articles (other
15 than Food) intended to affect the structure or any function of the body of humans or other
16 animals; and (4) articles intended for use as a component of any article specified in (1), (2), or
17 (3); but does not include devices or their components, parts, or accessories.

19 F. “**Essentially Equivalent Product**” means a product that contains the identical
20 ingredients, except for inactive ingredients (e.g., inactive binders, colors, fillers, excipients), in
21 the same form and dosage, and with the same route of administration (e.g., orally, sublingually),
22 as the Covered Product; provided that the Covered Product may contain additional ingredients if
23 reliable scientific evidence generally accepted by experts in the field indicates that the amount
24 and combination of additional ingredients are unlikely to impede or inhibit the effectiveness of
25 the ingredients in the essentially equivalent product.
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1 G. “**FDA**” means the United States Food and Drug Administration.

2 H. “**Food**” means: (1) any article used for food or drink for humans or other animals;
3 (2) chewing gum; and (3) any article used for components of any such article.

4 I. “**Defendants**” means all of the Corporate Defendants and Individual Defendants,
5 individually, collectively, or in any combination.

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7 1. “**Corporate Defendants**” means Golden Sunrise Nutraceutical, Inc. and
8 Golden Sunrise Pharmaceutical, Inc., and their successors and assigns.

9 2. “**Individual Defendants**” means Huu Tieu and Stephen Meis.

10 3. “**Stipulating Defendants**” means Corporate Defendants and Huu Tieu.

11 **I. PROHIBITED DISEASE CLAIMS**

12 **IT IS ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants and Stipulating Defendants’ officers,
13 agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any
14 of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly, in
15 connection with the manufacturing, labeling, advertising, promotion, offering for sale, or sale of
16 any Covered Product must not make any representation, expressly or by implication, that such
17 product (1) treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or cures COVID-19; (2) treats, mitigates the
18 symptoms of, or cures cancer; (3) treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or cures Parkinson’s
19 disease; or (4) prevents, treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or cures any disease, unless the
20 representation is non-misleading, including that, at the time such representation is made, they
21 possess and rely upon competent and reliable scientific evidence that substantiates that the
22 representation is true.
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25 For purposes of this Section, “competent and reliable scientific evidence” means human
26 clinical testing of the Covered Product or of an Essentially Equivalent Product that is sufficient
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1 in quality and quantity, based on standards generally accepted by experts in the relevant disease,
2 condition, or function to which the representation relates, when considered in light of the entire
3 body of relevant and reliable scientific evidence, to substantiate that the representation is true.
4 Such testing must (1) be randomized, double-blind, and placebo-controlled; and (2) be conducted
5 by researchers qualified by training and experience to conduct such testing. In addition, all
6 underlying or supporting data and documents generally accepted by experts in the relevant field
7 as relevant to an assessment of such testing as described in the Section titled Preservation of
8 Records Relating to Competent and Reliable Human Clinical Tests or Studies must be available
9 for inspection and production to the Commission. Stipulating Defendants will have the burden of
10 proving that a product satisfies the definition of an Essentially Equivalent Product.
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12 **II. OTHER PROHIBITED HEALTH BENEFIT CLAIMS**

13 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants and Stipulating Defendants'
14 officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation
15 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly,
16 in connection with the manufacturing, labeling, advertising, promotion, offering for sale, or sale
17 of any Covered Product must not make any representation, other than representations covered
18 under the Section titled Prohibited Disease Claims, expressly or by implication, about the health
19 benefits, performance, or efficacy of such product, unless the representation is non-misleading,
20 including that, at the time such representation is made, they possess and rely upon competent and
21 reliable scientific evidence that is sufficient in quality and quantity based on standards generally
22 accepted by experts in the relevant disease, condition, or function to which the representation
23 relates, when considered in light of the entire body of relevant and reliable scientific evidence, to
24 substantiate that the representation is true.
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1 For purposes of this Section, “competent and reliable scientific evidence” means tests,
2 analyses, research, or studies (1) that have been conducted and evaluated in an objective manner
3 by experts in the relevant disease, condition, or function to which the representation relates; (2)
4 that are generally accepted by such experts to yield accurate and reliable results; and (3) that are
5 randomized, double-blind, and placebo-controlled human clinical testing of the Covered Product,
6 or of an Essentially Equivalent Product, when such experts would generally require such human
7 clinical testing to substantiate that the representation is true. In addition, when such tests or
8 studies are human clinical tests or studies, all underlying or supporting data and documents
9 generally accepted by experts in the field as relevant to an assessment of such testing as
10 described in the Section of this Order titled Preservation of Records Relating to Competent and
11 Reliable Human Clinical Tests or Studies must be available for inspection and production to the
12 Commission. Stipulating Defendants will have the burden of proving that a product satisfies the
13 definition of an Essentially Equivalent Product.
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16 **III. PROHIBITED MISREPRESENTATIONS REGARDING TESTS, STUDIES,
17 OTHER RESEARCH, OR FDA APPROVAL**

18 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants and Stipulating Defendants’
19 officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation
20 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly,
21 in connection with the manufacturing, labeling, advertising, promotion, offering for sale, or sale
22 of any product must not make any misrepresentation, expressly or by implication:

23 A. About the existence, contents, validity, results, conclusions, or interpretations of
24 any test, study, or other research, including that studies, research, or trials prove that any
25 Covered Product (1) prevents, treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or cures COVID-19;
26 (2) prevents, treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or cures cancer; (3) prevents, treats, mitigates the
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1 symptoms of, or cures Parkinson’s disease; or (4) prevents, treats, mitigates the symptoms of, or
2 cures any other disease.

3 B. That any benefit of such product is scientifically or clinically proven or otherwise
4 established; or

5 C. That the FDA has designated such product as a Regenerative Medicine Advance
6 Therapy or otherwise approved, endorsed, authorized, or recommended the product for any use.
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8 **IV. PRESERVATION OF RECORDS RELATING TO COMPETENT AND**
9 **RELIABLE HUMAN CLINICAL TESTS OR STUDIES**

10 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that, with regard to any human clinical test or study
11 (“Test”) upon which Stipulating Defendants rely to substantiate any claim covered by this Order,
12 Stipulating Defendants must secure and preserve all underlying or supporting data and
13 documents generally accepted by experts in the field as relevant to an assessment of the Test,
14 including:

15 A. All protocols and protocol amendments, reports, articles, write-ups, or other
16 accounts of the results of the Test, and drafts of such documents reviewed by the Test sponsor or
17 any other person not employed by the research entity;

18 B. All documents referring or relating to recruitment; randomization; instructions,
19 including oral instructions, to participants; and participant compliance;

20 C. Documents sufficient to identify all Test participants, including any participants
21 who did not complete the Test, and all communications with any participants relating to the Test;
22 all raw data collected from participants enrolled in the Test, including any participants who did
23 not complete the Test; source documents for such data; any data dictionaries; and any case report
24 forms;
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1 D. All documents referring or relating to any statistical analysis of any Test data,
2 including any pretest analysis, intent-to-treat analysis, or between-group analysis performed on
3 any Test data; and

4 E. All documents referring or relating to the sponsorship of the Test, including all
5 communications and contracts between any sponsor and the Test's researchers.
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7 *Provided, however,* the preceding preservation requirement does not apply to a Reliably
8 Reported Test, unless the Test was conducted, controlled, or sponsored, in whole or in part by:
9 (1) any Defendant; (2) any Defendant's officers, agents, representatives, or employees; (3) any
10 other person or entity in active concert or participation with any Defendant; (4) any person or
11 entity affiliated with or acting on behalf of any Defendant; (5) any supplier of any ingredient
12 contained in the product at issue to any of the foregoing or to the product's manufacturer; or
13 (6) the supplier or manufacturer of such product.
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15 For purposes of this Section, "Reliably Reported Test" means a report of the Test has
16 been published in a peer-reviewed journal, and such published report provides sufficient
17 information about the Test for experts in the relevant field to assess the reliability of the results.

18 For any Test conducted, controlled, or sponsored, in whole or in part, by Stipulating
19 Defendants, Stipulating Defendants must establish and maintain reasonable procedures to protect
20 the confidentiality, security, and integrity of any personal information collected from or about
21 participants. These procedures must be documented in writing and must contain administrative,
22 technical, and physical safeguards appropriate to size and complexity of Stipulating Defendants'
23 enterprise, the nature and scope of Stipulating Defendants' activities, and the sensitivity of the
24 personal information collected from or about the participants.
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1 **V. FDA APPROVED CLAIMS**

2 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that nothing in this Order prohibits Stipulating
3 Defendants, or Stipulating Defendants’ officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, or all other
4 persons in active concert or participation with any of them, from:

5 A. For any Drug, making a representation that is approved in labeling for such Drug
6 under any tentative final or final monograph promulgated by the FDA, or under any new Drug
7 application approved by the FDA; and
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9 B. For any product, making a representation that is specifically authorized in labeling
10 for such product by regulations promulgated by the FDA pursuant to the Nutrition Labeling and
11 Education Act of 1990 or authorized under Sections 303-304 of the Food and Drug
12 Administration Modernization Act of 1997.

13 **VI. FINANCIAL DISCLOSURES**

14 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants, within five (5) days of
15 service of this Order upon them, shall prepare and deliver to Plaintiff’s counsel:

16 A. Completed financial statements on the forms attached to this Order as
17 **Attachment A** (Financial Statement of Individual Defendant) for Defendant Tieu, and
18 **Attachment B** (Financial Statement of Corporate Defendant) for each Corporate Defendant; and
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20 B. Completed **Attachment C** (IRS Form 4506, Request for Copy of a Tax Return for
21 each Individual Defendant and Corporate Defendant).
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23 **VII. PROHIBITION ON RELEASE OF CUSTOMER INFORMATION**

24 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants, Stipulating Defendants’
25 officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation
26 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly,
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1 are hereby restrained and enjoined from:

2 A. Selling, renting, leasing, transferring, or otherwise disclosing, the name, address,
3 birth date, telephone number, email address, credit card number, bank account number, Social
4 Security number, or other financial or identifying information of any person that any Defendant
5 obtained in connection with any activity that pertains to the subject matter of this Order; and
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7 B. Benefitting from or using the name, address, birth date, telephone number, email
8 address, credit card number, bank account number, Social Security number, or other financial or
9 identifying information of any person that any Defendant obtained in connection with any
10 activity that pertains to the subject matter of this Order.

11 Provided, however, that Stipulating Defendants may disclose such identifying
12 information to a law enforcement agency, to their attorneys as required for their defense, as
13 required by any law, regulation, or court order, or in any filings, pleadings or discovery in this
14 action in the manner required by the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and by any protective
15 order in the case.
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17 **VIII. PRESERVATION OF RECORDS**

18 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants, Stipulating Defendants'
19 officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation
20 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly,
21 are hereby restrained and enjoined from:
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23 A. Destroying, erasing, falsifying, writing over, mutilating, concealing, altering,
24 transferring, or otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, Documents that
25 relate to: (1) the business, business practices, Assets, or business or personal finances of any
26 Defendant; (2) the business practices or finances of entities directly or indirectly under the
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1 control of any Defendant; or (3) the business practices or finances of entities directly or
2 indirectly under common control with any other Defendant; and

3 B. Failing to create and maintain Documents that, in reasonable detail, accurately,
4 fairly, and completely reflect Defendants' income, disbursements, transactions, and use of
5 Defendants' Assets.

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7 **IX. REPORT OF NEW BUSINESS ACTIVITY**

8 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants, Stipulating Defendants'
9 officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation
10 with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting directly or indirectly,
11 are hereby restrained and enjoined from creating, operating, or exercising any control over any
12 business entity, whether newly formed or previously inactive, including any partnership, limited
13 partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or corporation, without first providing Plaintiff's
14 counsel with a written statement disclosing: (1) the name of the business entity; (2) the address
15 and telephone number of the business entity; (3) the names of the business entity's officers,
16 directors, principals, managers, and employees; and (4) a detailed description of the business
17 entity's intended activities.
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19 **X. DISTRIBUTION OF ORDER BY DEFENDANTS**

20 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants shall immediately provide a
21 copy of this Order to each affiliate, telemarketer, marketer, sales entity, successor, assign,
22 member, officer, director, employee, agent, independent contractor, client, attorney, spouse,
23 subsidiary, division, and representative of Stipulating Defendants, and shall, within ten (10) days
24 from the date of entry of this Order, and provide Plaintiff with a sworn statement that this
25 provision of the Order has been satisfied, which statement shall include the names, physical
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1 addresses, phone number, and email addresses of each such person or entity who received a copy
2 of the Order. Furthermore, Stipulating Defendants shall not take any action that would encourage
3 officers, agents, members, directors, employees, salespersons, independent contractors,
4 attorneys, subsidiaries, affiliates, successors, assigns or other persons or entities in active concert
5 or participation with them to disregard this Order or believe that they are not bound by its
6 provisions.
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8 **XI. SUSPENSION OF COLLECTION OF ACCOUNTS**

9 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that Stipulating Defendants and Stipulating
10 Defendants' officers, agents, employees, and attorneys, and all other persons in active concert
11 or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order, whether acting
12 directly or indirectly, are hereby restrained and enjoined from assigning any right to collect,
13 attempting to collect, or collecting any payment for the Covered Products.
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15 **XII. SERVICE OF THIS ORDER**

16 **IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that copies of this Order as well as the Motion for
17 Preliminary Injunction and Other Equitable Relief and all other pleadings, Documents, and
18 exhibits filed contemporaneously with that Motion (other than the complaint and summons), may
19 be served by any means, including facsimile transmission, electronic mail or other electronic
20 messaging, personal or overnight delivery, U.S. Mail or FedEx, by agents and employees of
21 Plaintiff, by any law enforcement agency, or by private process server, upon Stipulating
22 Defendants or any person (including any financial institution) that may have possession, custody
23 or control of any Asset or Document of Stipulating Defendants, or that may be subject to any
24 provision of this Order pursuant to Rule 65(d)(2) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure. For
25 purposes of this Section, service upon any branch, subsidiary, affiliate or office of any entity
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
1 shall effect service upon the entire entity.

2 **XIII. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION**
