

Davis & Schroeder is a boutique intellectual property firm specializing in matters relating to the Internet, with its new frontier of issues, as well as protecting and licensing hardware and software for the computer industry and other businesses. Mr. Davis is one of the two founding principals of the law firm.

Mr. Davis has over thirty years of experience in advising high technology clients on royalties, licensing and intellectual property matters, based upon his forty-one years of practice as a business lawyer. He has served as an expert witness in high tech disputes involving industry practices and has been an AAA arbitrator or mediator in a number of similar cases. His involvement for clients has included helping to establish, acquire, or sell many business enterprises, and the performance of due diligence audits as a part of the sale.

More recently, with the rapid development of the Internet, Mr. Davis has handled a number of Internet-related matters, including a series of disputes over domain names and conflicting trademarks. He brought one of the first successful cases against a trademark owner disputing the right of the trademark owner to take the domain name away from the registrant. He also deals with copyright, trademark, trade secrets, and patent licensing on a nearly daily basis.

Mr. Davis is an expert in copyright law, trademarks, trade secrets and licensing. He advises multinational and domestic companies in this field, and frequently serves as an expert witness or arbitrator in high tech litigation matters. He has set up, operated and supervised clean rooms involving reverse engineering projects for numerous multinational clients over the past 20 years, as a result of which he has become world renowned in the field, and has spoken to groups of lawyers and engineers all over the world on the subject. He has written extensively on the subject and is considered one of the two or three leading lawyers in this area. Currently, Mr. Davis is working on major multimedia and interactive TV projects for national clients. In

addition, over the past 30 years he has handled the legal and intellectual property aspects of establishment of a number of joint ventures, acquisitions, development projects and licensing matters for clients in the computer industry.

Mr. Davis has practiced business law since 1958 and computer and intellectual property law since 1971. He graduated from Georgetown University Law Center, Washington, D.C., with his J.D. in 1958. He served on the Board of Editors of the Georgetown Law Journal and graduated third in his class of 206. His undergraduate degree is a Bachelor of Science in Foreign Service, which is a combination of International Relations and Economics.

He is a member of the State Bar of California and the Bar of the District of Columbia, as well as being admitted to practice before the U.S. Supreme Court, the U.S. Tax Court, the U.S. Courts of Appeal for the Third, Ninth, Tenth and Eleventh Circuits, the Federal Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, and numerous U.S. District Courts across the country.
