

PANKAJ GHEMAWAT

Pankaj Ghemawat is Jaime and Josefina Chua Tiampo Professor of Business Administration, Head, Strategy Unit, Harvard Business School. Professor Pankaj Ghemawat received his A.B. degree in Applied Mathematics from Harvard College in 1979 and was elected to Phi Beta Kappa. He also pursued his doctoral studies at Harvard, specializing in industrial organization and development economics, and received his Ph.D. in Business Economics in 1982. Over 1982 and 1983, Dr. Ghemawat was a consultant with McKinsey & Company in London. In late 1983, he returned to Harvard Business School to teach Industry and Competitive Analysis, an advanced course on strategy formulation. In 1991, he was appointed the youngest full professor in the School's history.

Professor Ghemawat's current teaching and research focus on globalization and strategy. He teaches an MBA elective by that name and, over the last two years, has written more than a dozen cases and a dozen articles or working papers on this topic. He is currently engaged in writing a book on this broad area. His other books include *Commitment* (Free Press, 1991), *Games Businesses Play* (MIT Press, 1997) and *Strategy and the Business Landscape* (Addison Wesley Longman, 1999).

Professor Ghemawat serves on the editorial boards of *Management Science*, the *Journal of Economics and Management Strategy*, *Long Range Planning*, the *Strategic Management Journal*, and *Strategic Organization*. He is also a member of the international advisory council of the Instituto de Altos Estudios Empresariales (Buenos Aires).
