FINAL JUDGMENT AND ORDER FOR PERMANENT INJUNCTION
AGAINST TONY ANDREOPOULOS

Plaintiff, the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC" or "the Commission"), commenced this action by filing its Complaint, followed by a First Amended Complaint, for injunctive and other equitable relief pursuant to Sections 13(b) and 19 of the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), 15 U.S.C. §§ 53(b) and 57b, the Telemarketing and Consumer Fraud and Abuse Prevention Act ("Telemarketing Act"), 15 U.S.C. §§ 6101, *et seq.*, charging that the defendants engaged in deceptive acts or practices in violation of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a), and the FTC's Trade Regulation Rule entitled "Telemarketing Sales Rule," 16 C.F.R. Part 310.

On Sept, 19, 2007, the Court granted the FTC's Motion for Motion for Partial Summary Judgment Against Tony Anderopoulos and entered an order finding him liable for Counts I through III of the FTC's First Amended Complaint.

The Commission now seeks the entry of a final judgment against Tony Andreopoulos

pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 54. Having considered the memorandum and exhibits filed in support of the Commission's motion and the entire record in this matter, and now being fully advised in the premises, the Court **ORDERES, ADJUDGES, AND DECREES** as follows:

FINDINGS

1. This is an action by the Commission instituted under Sections 13(b) and 19 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 53(b) and 57b, the Telemarketing Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 6101, *et seq.*, and the FTC's Telemarketing Sales Rule, 16 C.F.R. Part 310. Pursuant to these statutes and regulations, the Commission has the authority to seek the relief contained herein.

2. The Commission's First Amended Complaint states a claim upon which relief may be granted against Defendant Tony Andreopoulos under Sections 5, 13(b), and 19 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 45, 53(b) and 57b, the Telemarketing Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 6101, *et seq.*, and the FTC's Telemarketing Sales Rule, 16 C.F.R. Part 310.

3. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case and all parties hereto.

4. Venue in the United States District Court for the Northern District of Illinois is proper under 15 U.S.C. § 53(b) and 28 U.S.C. § 1391(b), (c), and (d).

5. The alleged activities of Defendant Tony Andreopoulos are in or affecting commerce, as defined in Section 4 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 44.

6. Defendant Tony Andreopoulos was properly served with process in this matter.

7. On Sept. 19, 2007, the Court entered an order granting Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission's Motion for Partial Summary Judgment Against Tony Andreopoulos, finding him liable for Counts I, II, and III of the the FTC's First Amended Complaint.

8. The factual allegations pertaining to Counts I, II, and III of the Commission's First Amended Complaint are taken as true against Defendant Tony Andreopoulos. Those allegations and the evidence supporting them establish that Defendant Tony Andreopoulos violated Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a) and Sections 310.3(a)(2)(iii) and 310.4(a)(4) of the Telemarketing Sales Rule, 16 C.F.R. Part 310.

9. Defendant Tony Andreopoulos is likely to continue to engage in the acts and practices alleged in the First Amended Complaint unless he is permanently enjoined from such acts and practices.

10. The Commission is entitled to equitable monetary relief against Defendant Tony Andreopoulos in the amount of \$9,894,514 (USD).

11. This Order is in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other civil or criminal remedies that may be provided by law.

12. Entry of this Order is in the public interest.

13. Pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(d), the provisions of this Order are binding upon Defendant Tony Andreopoulos, his officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, corporations, successors and assigns, and upon those persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise.

DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Order, the following definitions shall apply:

1. "Defendant" means Defendant Tony Andreopoulos.
2. "Asset" or "assets" means any legal or equitable interest in, right to, or claim to, any real and personal property, including, but not limited to, chattels, goods, instruments,
