I am writing this letter because I am concerned about the proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993. As a business consultant for 30 years, I see restraint of free trade for tiny business startups as unnecessary to propose and burdensome to enforce.

I understand that part of the FTC's responsibilities is to protect the public from "unfair and deceptive acts or practices." If you want to really protect the public, then go after franchise and multi-level marketing businesses above \$1000 for start up costs. They are the ones who lose the most in these cases. Anything below that \$1000, like Sunrider, isn't worth monitoring.

I am against business start-up costs with a seven-day waiting period. That logic shrinks the national economy.

I have been an independent Sunrider distributor for 19 years. I don't make thousands, maybe hundreds a month. But enough to buy my Sunrider foods, which I love regularly. I use them as my core nutrition. All other foods I find a waste of money and time, mostly.
