The contact lens rule does not address the issue of licensed opticians who by state law are permitted to fit and adapt contact lenses. It is common practice in the majority of states that allow contact lens fitting by opticians to interpret the term contact lens prescription as the eyeglasses prescription and the notation "Ok for Contact Lenses" . After a licensed optician receives the above written statement from the ophthalmologists or optometrists, the optician may proceed with the contact lens fitting and dispensing of the contact lenses directly to the consumer. The Federal Trade Commission should add the following to the definition of contact lens prescription: "A contact lens prescription when filled by an independent licensed optician permitted by state law to perform a contact lens fitting is the eyeglasses prescription and the notation of "OK for contact lenses" or similar language on the prescription provided there are no contraindications for contact lenses." It should also be illegal for prescribers not give the "Ok for Contact lenses" to independent licensed opticians permitted under state law to do contact lens fitting if the prescriber would have fitted the patient himself or herself. The above will balance the competition among optometrists, ophthalmologists and opticians. If the Federal Trade Commission does not do the above, it would restrict trade and prevent consumers access to a large pool of already qualified opticians licensed to perform contact lens fittings under state law. .
