
My husband and I fully support your proposal to allow individuals to add their names to a national registry to limit telemarketing phone calls. The phone calls are intrusive and an invasion of our right to privacy and “peace” in our home.

We have never responded positively to a telemarketing phone call, yet we are inundated with the calls at the most inconvenient times. Frankly, we have given up trying to be polite, some of the sales people are either incredulous or down right rude when we tactfully try to tell them that we are not interested. Now we just say, “No” and hang up – yet the phone calls continue.

An infuriating trick is the use of an automatic dialing system that dials several numbers at the same time. The telemarketer talks to the first number that is answered, and the system cuts off the other lines. Therefore, when you answer the phone there is a dead line. You know what has happened, and you are helpless to do anything about it.

Telemarketers do not have a First Amendment Right to harass us, infuriate us, or invade our privacy.


To Whom It May Concern:





TELEMARKETING RULEMAKING – COMMENT

Dear Sirs/Madames,

I write to express my overwhelming support for any plan to reign in the burgeoning proliferation and resulting annoyance and frustration of telemarketing calls.

I am continually frustrated at my inability to stop telemarketers from invading my privacy with unsolicited calls. Many are now using recorded messages which do not afford me human contact to request removal of my phone number and name from their lists. When

I have called a number given in the recorded message, it is often an "800" number (which when called, automatically and without my permission captures my phone number – even if it is unlisted!) and I am told they are just an answering service and can not remove my phone number! I honestly feel as though I am being violated by these calls and I consider them an harassment. (In one instance, after I had rudely hung up on a telemarketer, they called me back and hung up on me! In another, my number was put on the top of the list and I received several calls a day, for a week, from the same people.)

Some sort of firm, enforceable, national do-not-call listing/legislation is desperately needed and will be greatly appreciated. I would not be upset if charities, police, fire, and other non-profits were included.






