

Re: Gramm/Leach/Bliley Act

Dear Sir or Madam:

I am a licensed private investigator in the State of Washington. I use credit header information (not the credit reports containing financial information themselves) to find dead-beat parents, to serve process, to collect scam artist's judgments, and to find uninsured motorists who refuse to be responsible for the accidents they cause. **Passage of the above act will virtually guaranty that these people will continue on their merry way, reeking their financial destruction on the innocent public.**
