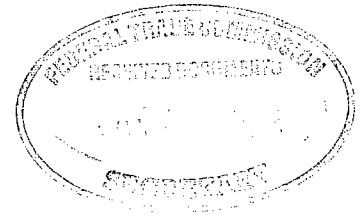

FIRST REVISED SCHEDULING ORDER


The Scheduling Order in this matter is hereby revised as follows:

- January 23, 2004 - Deadline for filing reply in support of motion for summary decision.
- January 30, 2004 - Deadline for filing motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits. Responses to motions for *in camera* treatment shall be filed within ten days after service.
- January 30, 2004 - Deadline for filing motions *in limine* and motions to strike.
- February 10, 2004 - Deadline for filing responses to motions *in limine* and motions to strike.
- February 13, 2004 - Deadline for filing response to reply on motion for summary decision.
- February 20, 2004 - Complaint Counsel files pretrial brief, to include proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law. To the extent possible, findings of fact shall be supported by document citations and/or deposition citations. Conclusions of law shall be supported by legal authority.
- February 25, 2004 - Exchange and serve courtesy copy on ALJ objections to final proposed witness lists and exhibit lists. Exchange objections to the designated testimony to be presented by deposition and counter designations.

- March 2, 2004 - Exchange proposed stipulations of law, facts, and authenticity.
- March 5, 2004 - Respondent's Counsel files pretrial brief, to include proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law. To the extent possible, findings of fact shall be supported by document citations and/or deposition citations. Conclusions of law shall be supported by legal authority.
- March 9, 2004 - File final stipulations of law, facts, and authenticity. Any subsequent stipulations may be filed as agreed by the parties.
- March 11, 2004 - Final prehearing conference to be held at 10:00 a.m. in room 532, Federal Trade Commission Building, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. The parties are to meet and confer prior to the conference regarding trial logistics and proposed stipulations of law, facts, and authenticity and any designated deposition testimony. Counsel may present any objections to the final proposed witness lists and exhibits, including the designated testimony to be presented by deposition. Trial exhibits will be admitted or excluded to the extent practicable.
- March 16, 2004 - Commencement of Hearing, to begin at 10:00 a.m. in room 532, Federal Trade Commission Building, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The additional provisions set forth in the Scheduling Order issued on September 4, 2003 remain in effect and unchanged.
