## ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION OF NON-PARTY FULTON COUNTY HEALTH CENTER FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE FOR *IN CAMERA* TREATMENT

On May 3, 2011, Non-party Fulton County Health Center ("FCHC") filed a Motion for Extension of Time to file a motion for *in camera* treatment. *See* 16 C.F.R.§ 3.45(b) ("Motion"). Under the Scheduling Order in this case, the deadline for submitting Motions for *In Camera* Treatment under Rule 3.45(b) is May 5, 2011. FCHC seeks an extension of time until May 13, 2011.

In support of the Motion, FCHC states that by letter from Complaint Counsel dated April 28, 2011, FCHC was notified of Complaint Counsel's intent to offer into evidence at the hearing in this matter certain identified data, documents and testimony. FCHC further states that it is in the process of preparing to make the necessary showing for obtaining *in camera* treatment of certain confidential records, but that the Administrator of FCHC, who will be providing a declaration in support of the anticipated motion, is temporarily absent from his office. Therefore, FCHC asserts, it needs additional time to complete a motion for *in camera* treatment. FCHC states that Complaint Counsel and counsel for Respondent have advised that they do not oppose the Motion.

Based on the foregoing, there is good cause to extend the deadline as requested. 16 C.F.R. § 3.21(c). Moreover, extension of the deadline will not affect other pending deadlines in the case, the commencement of the evidentiary hearing, or the issuance of an initial decision in the case. *Id.* Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED, and it is hereby ORDERED that the deadline for Non-party Fulton County Health Center to file a Motion for *In Camera* Treatment shall be May 13, 2011.
