

**ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION OF
NON-PARTY CONNECTICUT GENERAL LIFE INSURANCE CO. FOR
EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE FOR *IN CAMERA* TREATMENT**

On May 5, 2011, Non-party Connecticut General Life Insurance Co. ("CIGNA") filed a Motion for Extension of Time to file a motion for *in camera* treatment. See 16 C.F.R. § 3.45(b) ("Motion"). Under the Scheduling Order in this case, the deadline for submitting Motions for *In Camera* Treatment under Rule 3.45(b) is May 5, 2011. CIGNA seeks to extend the deadline by one-week, until May 12, 2011.

In support of the Motion, CIGNA asserts that it was notified by Complaint Counsel and Respondent's counsel, by e-mails dated April 26 and 27, and April 28, 2011, respectively, that they each may seek to introduce into evidence at trial certain documents, testimony and patient claims data of CIGNA that CIGNA believes constitute confidential information. CIGNA states that it has been reviewing the materials and identifying those materials or documents for which CIGNA will seek *in camera* treatment but that additional time is necessary in order to prepare a motion making the requisite showing. CIGNA further states that it has conferred with Complaint Counsel and counsel for Respondent and that they do not oppose the instant Motion.

Based on the foregoing, there is good cause to grant CIGNA a one-week extension of time to file a motion for *in camera* treatment. 16 C.F.R. § 3.21(c). Moreover, extension of this deadline as requested will not affect other pending deadlines in the case, the commencement of the evidentiary hearing, or the issuance of an initial decision in the case. *Id.* Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED and it is hereby ORDERED that the deadline for Non-party Connecticut General Life Insurance Co. to file a Motion for *In Camera* Treatment shall be May 12, 2011.
