Defendant, the Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”), hereby moves to dismiss this action under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 12(b)(1) because the Court is without jurisdiction. The United States has filed a complaint against plaintiff (“C4C”) and other defendants in the Northern District of Florida alleging that defendants have engaged in deceptive telemarketing campaigns. This Court is without jurisdiction over the instant case for several reasons. First, the FTC’s enforcement activities that plaintiff seeks to challenge do not constitute final agency action, as required by the Administrative Procedure Act (“APA”), 5 U.S.C. § 704. Next, the APA only permits challenges to final agency action for which there is “no other adequate remedy
