Dear Secretary Clark:

The purpose of this letter is to express our support for the Federal Trade Commission's (FTC) consideration of a regulatory requirement for manufacturers and importers of garments to provide consumers with a professional wet cleaning label when applicable. As we stated in our letter to FTC on July 27, 2011, we believe that doing so is an important step towards educating the public and the dry cleaning industry about the professional wet cleaning alternatives available.

In December 2007, the California Air Resources Board adopted a regulation that eliminates the use of perchloroethylene (Perc) in dry cleaning operations by 2023. To date, about two-thirds of the cleaners have switched to alternative dry cleaning systems and over 200 have chosen a water-based technology. California also has a non-toxic dry cleaning incentive program (Assembly Bill 998) that provides \$10,000 grants to switch from cleaning systems using Perc to non-toxic and non-smog forming technologies. About 130 cleaners have taken advantage of this program.

As a result of the changes within the dry cleaning industry in California, we support requiring garment manufacturers to include professional wet cleaning information on the garment care label. We believe this action will aid California's efforts to move forward with cleaner dry cleaning technologies.
