There are also dangerous drugs in veterinary medicine used for tranquiller and sedatives, reproductive uses and topical insecticides and pesticides that require patient safety education before being dispensed that are taught in these modules.

There are currently 18 board certified diplomates with a total of over 400 years' experience in practice of veterinary pharmacy at academic institutions to include NIH and veterinary colleges in North America. This organization is affiliated with the Society of Veterinary Hospital Pharmacists (SVHP) and has the expertise to participate in the quality academic advancement of veterinary pharmacy in both the professional and post-degree education programs. ALL ICVP pharmacists teach veterinary students, and are active in teaching pharmacy students as a pharmacy preceptor for professional interns/externs. Residency programs are available at various universities. Many of the veterinary pharmacists also teach electives in the core curriculum of pharmacy colleges.
