Plaintiff, Federal Trade Commission ("FTC"), having filed its Complaint for a Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief in this matter, pursuant to Section 13(b) of the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), 15 U.S.C. § 53(b), and having moved for an *ex parte* Temporary Restraining Order and other relief pursuant to Rule 65 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, Fed. R. Civ. P. 65, and the Court having considered the complaint, declarations,

exhibits, and memorandum of law filed in support thereof and having held an on the record <u>ex</u> <u>parte</u> hearing, finds that:

FINDINGS:

- 1. This Court has jurisdiction over the subject matter of this case, and there is good cause to believe it will have jurisdiction over the defendants.
- 2. Venue lies properly with this Court.
- 3. There is good cause to believe that Loma International Business Groups, Inc.,
 Servicios LatinoAmericanos de Maryland, Inc., Manuel E. Alban, and Lola P.
 Alban (collectively referred to as "Defendants") have engaged in, and are likely to
 engage in, acts and practices that violate Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. §
 45(a), and that the FTC is likely to prevail on the merits of this action.
- 4. There is good cause to believe that immediate and irreparable damage to the Court's ability to grant effective final relief for consumers including rescission or reformation of contracts, restitution, the refund of monies paid, and the disgorgement of ill-gotten monies will occur from the sale, transfer, or other disposition or concealment by Defendants of assets or records if Defendants are provided with advance notice of this Order, and that therefore in accordance with Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b), the interests of justice require that this Order be granted without prior notice to Defendants.
- 5. There is good cause for relieving Plaintiff FTC of the duty to provide Defendants with prior notice of Plaintiff FTC's application.
- 6. Good cause exists for the appointment of a Temporary Monitor over Corporate

Defendants Loma International Business Group, Inc. and Servicios LatinoAmericanos de Maryland, Inc.

- 7. Considering Plaintiff FTC's likelihood of ultimate success and weighing the equities, a Temporary Restraining Order with an asset freeze, the appointment of a Temporary Monitor, and other equitable relief is in the public interest.
- 8. No security is required of any agency of the United States for issuance of a restraining order. Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c).

DEFINITIONS

For purposes of this Temporary Restraining Order ("Order"), the following definitions shall apply:

- "Asset" means any legal or equitable interest in, right to, or claim to, any real or personal property, including, but not limited to, "goods," "instruments," "equipment," "fixtures," "general intangibles," "inventory," "checks," or "notes" (as these terms are defined in the Uniform Commercial Code), lines of credit, chattels, leaseholds, contracts, mail or other deliveries, shares of stock, lists of consumer names, accounts, credits, premises, receivables, funds, and all cash, wherever located.
- 2. "Assisting others" includes, but is not limited to: (1) performing customer service functions, including, but not limited to, receiving or responding to consumer complaints; (2) formulating or providing, or arranging for the formulation or provision of, any sales script or other marketing material; (3) providing names of, or assisting in the generation of, potential customers;

- (4) performing or providing marketing or billing services of any kind; (5) acting as an officer or director of a business entity; or (6) providing telemarketing services.
- 3. "Customer" means any person who purchased, agreed to purchase, or was charged for immigration services from any Defendant prior to the date of this Order.
- 4. "Defendants" means Loma International Business Group, Inc., Servicios

 LatinoAmericanos de Maryland, Inc., Manuel E. Alban, and Lola P. Alban,
 individually, collectively, or in any combination.
- "Individual Defendants" refers to Defendants Manuel E. Alban and Lola P.
 Alban.
- 6. "Corporate Defendants" refers to Defendants Loma International Business
 Groups, Inc. and Servicios LatinoAmericanos de Maryland, Inc.
- "Document" means any materials listed in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 34(a) and includes writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, audio and video recordings, computer records, digital records, and other data compilations from which information can be obtained and translated, if necessary, into reasonably usable form through detection devices. A draft or nonidentical copy is a separate Document within the meaning of the term.
- 8. "Financial institution" means any bank, savings and loan institution, credit union, or any financial depository of any kind, including, but not limited to, any

brokerage house, trustee, broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading company, or precious metal dealer.

- 9. "Immigration services" means any service provided to a person to aid or purporting to aid that person in any United States immigration matter such as by:

 (a) appearing in any immigration case, either in person or through the preparation or filing of any brief or other document, paper, application, petition, or other form on behalf of another person before or with any branch of the United States

 Department of Homeland Security or the United States Department of Justice; (b) selecting or providing which visa, work permit, temporary protective status, residency, or other immigration status or benefit to apply for, or which application or other form to use, or providing advice regarding these selections; (c) advising a person regarding the requirements for obtaining a visa, a work permit, temporary protective status, residency, or any other immigration status or benefit; or (d) advising a person regarding his or her answers on any immigration related document, paper, application, petition, or other form.
- "Mail" includes, but is not limited to, all envelopes, papers, or other items delivered, whether by United States Mail, United Parcel Service, FedEx, electronic mail, or similar delivery service.
- "Person" means a natural person, an organization or other legal entity, including a corporation, partnership, sole proprietorship, limited liability company, association, cooperative, or any other group or combination acting as an entity.
- 12. "Temporary Monitor" means the monitor appointed in this Order. The term

"monitor" also includes any deputy monitor as may be named by the temporary monitor.

ORDER

CONDUCT PROHIBITIONS

I. Prohibitions Against Misrepresentations of Immigration Services

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Defendants, and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, or any of them, in connection with the advertising, marketing, promoting, offering for sale, sale, or provision of immigration services, are temporarily restrained and enjoined from misrepresenting, directly or indirectly, expressly or by implication, any material fact including but not limited to, that Defendants are authorized to provide immigration services in the United States.

II. Customer Information

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants, and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, are temporarily restrained and enjoined from using, selling, renting, leasing, transferring, or otherwise disclosing or benefitting from the name, address, birth date, telephone number, email address, passport number, Social Security number, credit or debit card number, bank account number, or other financial or identifying personal information of any person from whom or about whom any Defendant obtained such information in connection with activities alleged in the FTC's

Complaint.

Provided, however, that Defendants may disclose such financial or identifying personal information to a law enforcement agency or as required by any law, regulation, or court order.

III. Posting Notice of Lawsuit at Defendants' Business Premises

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants and their successors, assigns, members, officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service, facsimile transmission, email, or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, in connection with the advertising, marketing, promotion, offering for sale, or sale of any immigration service, shall prominently display the following statement at Defendants' business premises:

The Federal Trade Commission ("FTC") has filed a lawsuit against Loma International Business Group, Inc., Servicios LatinoAmericanos de Maryland, Inc., Manuel E. Alban, and Lola P. Alban, alleging that they have engaged in deceptive practices relating to the advertising, marketing, promotion, offering for sale, sale, or provision of immigration services. The United States District Court for the Northern District of Maryland has issued a Temporary Restraining Order prohibiting the alleged practices. You may obtain additional information from the court-appointed Temporary Monitor, H. Mark Stichel, Esq., of Gohn, Hankey & Stichel, 201 North Charles Street, Baltimore, Maryland 12101 or the Federal Trade Commission.

ASSET FREEZE AND DUTIES OF THIRD PARTIES

IV. Asset Freeze

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants, and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and those persons or entities in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting

directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, or any of them, except as provided herein, as stipulated by the parties, or as directed by further order of the Court, are temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

- A. Transferring, liquidating, converting, encumbering, pledging, loaning, selling, concealing, dissipating, disbursing, assigning, spending, withdrawing, granting a lien or security interest or other interest in, or otherwise disposing of any funds, real or personal property, accounts, contracts, shares of stock, lists of consumer names, or other assets, or any interest therein, wherever located, including outside the territorial United States, that are:
 - 1. owned, controlled, or held by, in whole or in part, for the benefit of, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any Defendant;
 - 2. in the actual or constructive possession of any Defendant; or
 - 3. in the actual or constructive possession of, or owned, controlled, or held by, or subject to access by, or belonging to, any other corporation, partnership, trust, or any other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by, or under common control with, any Defendant, including, but not limited to, any assets held by or for any Defendant in any account at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any credit card processing agent, automated clearing house processor, network transaction processor, bank debit processing agent, customer service agent, commercial mail receiving agency, or mail holding or forwarding company, or any credit union, retirement fund custodian, money market or

mutual fund, storage company, trustee, or with any broker-dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading company, precious metal dealer, or other financial institution or depository of any kind, either within or outside the territorial United States;

- B. Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit boxes, commercial mail boxes, or storage facilities titled in the name of any Defendant, or subject to access by any Defendant or under any Defendant's control, without providing the FTC prior notice and an opportunity to inspect the contents in order to determine that they contain no assets covered by this Section;
- C. Cashing any checks or depositing any payments from customers or clients of Defendants;
- D. Incurring charges or cash advances on any credit card issued in the name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant; or
- E. Incurring liens or encumbrances on real property, personal property, or other assets in the name, singly or jointly, of any Defendant or any corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by any Defendant.

The funds, property, and assets affected by this Section shall include both existing assets and assets acquired after the effective date of this Order.

V. Duties of Third Parties

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any financial institution, business entity, or person maintaining or having custody or control of any account or other asset of any Defendant, or any

corporation, partnership, or other entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by, or under common control with any Defendant, which is served with a copy of this Order, or otherwise has actual or constructive knowledge of this Order, shall:

- A. Hold and retain within its control and prohibit the withdrawal, removal, assignment, transfer, pledge, hypothecation, encumbrance, disbursement, dissipation, conversion, sale, liquidation, or other disposal of any of the assets, funds, documents, or other property held by, or under its control:
 - on behalf of, or for the benefit of, any Defendant or any other party subject to Section IV above;
 - 2. in any account maintained in the name of, or for the benefit of, or subject to withdrawal by, any Defendant or other party subject to Section IV above; and
 - 3. that are subject to access or use by, or under the signatory power of, any Defendant or other party subject to Section IV above;
- B. Deny Defendants access to any safe deposit boxes or storage facilities that are either:
 - 1. titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or other party subject to Section IV above; or
 - 2. subject to access by any Defendant or other party subject to Section IV above;
- C. Provide the FTC, within five (5) days of the date of service of this Order, a sworn statement setting forth:

- 1. The identification number of each account or asset titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or held on behalf of, or for the benefit of, any Defendant or other party subject to Section IV above, including all trust accounts managed on behalf of any Defendant or subject to any Defendant's control;
- 2. The balance of each such account, or a description of the nature and value of such asset;
- 3. The identification and location of any safe deposit box, commercial mail box, or storage facility that is either titled in the name, individually or jointly, of any Defendant, or is otherwise subject to access or control by any Defendant or other party subject to Section IV above, whether in whole or in part; and
- 4. If the account, safe deposit box, storage facility, or other asset has been closed or removed, the date closed or removed and the balance on said date;
- D. Allow representatives of Plaintiff FTC immediate access to inspect and copy, or upon Plaintiff FTC's request, within five (5) business days of said request, provide the FTC with copies of, all records or other documentation pertaining to each such account or asset, including, but not limited to, originals or copies of account applications, account statements, corporate resolutions, signature cards, checks, drafts, deposit tickets, transfers to and from the accounts, all other debit and credit instruments or slips, currency transaction reports, 1099 forms, and safe

- deposit box logs; and
- E. This Section shall apply to existing accounts and assets, assets deposited or accounts opened after the effective date of this Order, and any accounts or assets maintained, held or controlled two years prior to the effective date of this Order.

 This Section shall not prohibit transfers in accordance with any provision of this Order, any further order of the Court, or by written agreement of the parties.

VI. Repatriation of Assets and Documents

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants shall:

- A. Within three (3) business days following service of this Order, take such steps as are necessary to repatriate to the territory of the United States of America all documents and assets that are located outside such territory and are held by or for Defendants or are under Defendants' direct or indirect control, jointly, severally, or individually;
- B. Within three (3) business days following service of this Order, provide Plaintiff

 FTC with a full accounting of all documents and assets that are located outside of
 the territory of the United States of America or that have been transferred to the
 territory of the United States of America pursuant to Subsection A above and are
 held by or for any Defendant or are under any Defendant's direct or indirect
 control, jointly, severally, or individually, including the addresses and names of
 any foreign or domestic financial institution or other entity holding the documents
 and assets, along with the account numbers and balances;
- C. Hold and retain all such documents and assets and prevent any transfer,

D. Within three (3) business days following service of this Order, provide Plaintiff

FTC access to Defendants' records and documents held by financial institutions
or other entities outside the territorial United States, by signing and delivering to
Plaintiff FTC's counsel the Consent to Release of Financial Records attached to
this Order as Attachment A.

RECORD KEEPING PROVISIONS

VII. Financial Statements and Accounting

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within five (5) business days following the service of this Order:

- A. Each Individual Defendant shall prepare and deliver to FTC counsel a completed financial statement on the form captioned "Financial Statement of Individual Defendant," which is attached to this Order as Attachment B;
- B. Unless otherwise agreed upon with FTC counsel and the Temporary Monitor,

 Defendants shall also prepare and deliver to FTC counsel a completed financial
 statement on the form captioned "Financial Statement of Corporate Defendant,"

 which is attached to this Order as Attachment C, for each Corporate Defendant,

 and for each business entity owned, controlled or managed by the Individual

 Defendants, regardless of whether it is a defendant in this case. The financial
 statements shall be accurate as of the date and time of entry of this Order; and
- C. Each Defendant shall also prepare and deliver to FTC counsel:
 - 1. A completed statement, verified under oath:

- a. specifying the name and address of each financial institution and brokerage firm at which the Defendant has accounts or safe deposit boxes. Said statements shall include assets held in foreign as well as domestic accounts; and
- b. listing all persons who have received payments, transfers, or assignment of funds, assets, or property which total \$10,000 or more in any twelve-month period since January 1, 2001. This list shall specify: (a) the amount(s) transferred or assigned; (b) the name of each transferee or assignee; (c) the date of the assignment or transfer; and (d) the type and amount of consideration paid to the Defendant:
- 2. For each immigration service advertised, marketed, promoted, offered for sale, or sold by the Defendants, a detailed accounting, verified under oath, of:
 - a. all gross revenues obtained from the sale of each such good or service (broken down by month and year) from January 1, 2001, through the date of the issuance of this Order;
 - b. all net profits obtained from the sale of each such good or service (broken down by month and year) from January 1, 2001, through the date of the issuance of this Order;
 - c. the total amount of each such good or service sold (broken down by month and year) from January 1, 2001, through the date of the

- issuance of this Order; and
- d. the full name, address, and telephone number of every purchaser or recipient of each such good or service, and the amount paid by each, from January 1, 2001, through the date of the issuance of this Order.

VIII. Records Maintenance and New Business Activity

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants, and their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all other persons in active concert or participation with any of them, who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any trust, corporation, subsidiary, division, or other device, or any of them, are temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

- A. Failing to create and maintain books, records, accounts, bank statements, current accountants' reports, general ledgers, general journals, cash receipt ledgers, cash disbursement ledgers and source documents, documents indicating title to real or personal property, and any other data which, in reasonable detail, accurately, fairly and completely reflect the incomes, disbursements, transactions, dispositions, and uses of the Defendants' assets;
- B. Destroying, erasing, mutilating, concealing, altering, transferring, or otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any documents, including electronically-stored materials, that relate in any way to the business practices or business or personal finances of Defendants; to the business practices or finances of entities directly or indirectly under the control of Defendants; or to the business

- practices or finances of entities directly or indirectly under common control with any other Defendant; and
- C. Creating, operating, or exercising any control over any new business entity, whether newly formed or previously inactive, including any partnership, limited partnership, joint venture, sole proprietorship, or corporation, without first providing Plaintiff FTC with a written statement disclosing: (1) the name of the business entity; (2) the address and telephone number of the business entity; (3) the names of the business entity's officers, directors, principals, managers, and employees; and (4) a detailed description of the business entity's intended activities.

TEMPORARY MONITOR PROVISIONS

IX. Appointment of Temporary Monitor

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that H. Mark Stichel, Esq., of Gohn, Hankey & Stichel, 201 North Charles Street, Baltimore, Maryland 12101 is appointed Temporary Monitor for Defendants. The Temporary Monitor shall be the sole agent of this Court acting under this Order. The Temporary Monitor shall be accountable directly to this Court.

X. Immediate Access to Defendants' Business Premises

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Temporary Monitor and his representatives and agents shall have immediate access to any business premises of the Defendants, and immediate access to any other location where any Defendant has conducted business or where property or business records are likely to be located. Such business premises locations specifically include, but are not limited to, the offices and facilities of one or more of the Corporate Defendants at 10

North Calvert Street, Suite 700, Baltimore, Maryland 21202; and any storage facility that the Temporary Monitor learns is being used to store records or property of any Defendant.

- A. The purpose of such access is to implement and carry out the Temporary

 Monitor's duties set forth in Section XI of this order and to inspect and inventory
 all of the immigration forms and supporting documents, and inspect and copy any
 documents relevant to this action. The Temporary Monitor and those specifically
 designated by him shall have the right to remove the above-listed documents from
 those premises in order that they may be inspected, inventoried, copied,
 preserved, and returned to immigration services customers;
- B. In connection with gaining access to Defendants' premises, the Temporary

 Monitor is authorized to use the assistance of law enforcement officers as the

 Temporary Monitor deems necessary to effect service and to implement

 peacefully the provisions of this Order;
- C. The Temporary Monitor shall allow the FTC's representatives, agents, and assistants, as well as Defendants and their representatives, reasonable access to the business premises of Defendants. The purpose of this access shall be to inspect and copy any and all books, records, accounts, and other property, including computer data, owned by or in the possession of the Defendants; and
- D. The Temporary Monitor is authorized to provide continued access to any business premises of the Defendants to law enforcement officers, as he deems fit; and to refer to those law enforcement officers any documents or information that may appear to be relevant to his duties.

XI. Temporary Monitor Duties

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Temporary Monitor is directed and authorized to accomplish the following:

- A. Take exclusive custody, control, and possession of all immigration forms and supporting documents of, or in the possession or custody or under the control of Defendants, wherever situated, including without limitation all paper documents and all electronic data and devices that contain or store electronic data pertaining to Defendants' immigration services, including but not limited to, computers, laptops, data storage devices, back-up tapes, DVDs, CDs, and thumb drives and all other external storage devices and, as to equipment in the possession or under the control of the Defendants, all PDAs, smart phones, cellular telephones, and similar devices issued or paid for by Defendants;
- B. Take all steps necessary to secure all immigration forms and supporting documents located at Defendants' business premises, including but not limited to, all such premises located at 10 North Calvert Street, Suite 700, Baltimore, Maryland 21202. Such steps may include, but are not limited to, the following as the Temporary Monitor deems necessary or advisable: (1) serving this Order on any person or entity; (2) obtaining pertinent information from all employees and other agents of the Defendants, including but not limited to, the name, home address, social security number, job description, method of compensation, and all accrued and unpaid FTCs and compensation of each such employee or agent; and (3) requiring any persons present on the business premises at the time this Order

- to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Temporary Monitor that such persons are not removing from the premises immigration forms or supporting documents;
- C. Identify, review, and copy the Defendants' business records and financial transactions as they relate to the immigration services practices alleged in the FTC's Complaint and ensure that all such documents are preserved;
- D. Identify and create a contact list of all Defendants' immigration services customers;
- E. Provide timely notice to Defendants' immigration services customers of their right to take possession of their own immigration forms and supporting documents;
- F. Return all immigration forms and supporting documents to Defendants' customers who request their immigration forms and supporting documents;
- G. Provide information about authorized immigration service providers in the Baltimore, Maryland area to facilitate any immigration services customer's request for assistance with their immigration applications;
- H. Retain exclusive custody, control, and possession of all immigration forms and supporting documents not returned to any immigration services customers until such time as the Court directs otherwise;
- I. Choose, engage, and employ attorneys, accountants, appraisers, and other independent contractors and technical specialists (collectively, "Professionals"), as the Temporary Monitor deems advisable or necessary in the performance of duties and responsibilities under the authority granted by this Order, which

- Professionals shall apply for payment of fees and costs along with the Temporary Monitor and be paid from Defendants' assets;
- J. Determine and implement the manner in which Defendants will comply with, and prevent violations of, this Order and all other applicable laws including, but not limited to, revising sales materials and implementing monitoring procedures;
- K. Maintain accurate records of all receipts and expenditures that he makes as
 Temporary Monitor;
- L. Cooperate with reasonable requests for information or assistance from any state or federal law enforcement agency; and
- M. Make periodic reports, observations and recommendations to this Court and seek guidance and instructions from this Court if the Temporary Monitor deems necessary upon one day's written or oral notice to all parties who filed an appearance in this proceeding.

XII. Defendants' Cooperation With The Temporary Monitor

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Defendants and all other persons or entities served with a copy of this Order shall fully cooperate with and assist the Temporary Monitor. This cooperation and assistance shall include but not be limited to, providing information to the Temporary Monitor that the Temporary Monitor deems necessary in order to discharge the responsibilities of the Temporary Monitor under this Order; and providing any password required to access any computer, electronic file, or telephone data in any medium. Defendants are temporarily restrained and enjoined from directly or indirectly:

A. Transacting any of the immigration services business of Defendants;

- B. Destroying, secreting, defacing, transferring, or otherwise altering or disposing of any immigration services forms or supporting documents of Defendants including, but not limited to, books, records, accounts, writings, drawings, graphs, charts, photographs, audio and video recordings, computer records, and other data compilations, electronically stored records, or any other papers of any kind or nature;
- C. Transferring, receiving, altering, selling, encumbering, pledging, assigning, liquidating, or otherwise disposing of any assets owned, controlled, or in the possession or custody of, or in which an interest is held or claimed by, the Defendants or the Temporary Monitor;
- D. Drawing on any existing line of credit available to Defendants;
- E. Excusing debts owed to Defendants;
- F. Doing any act that would, or failing to do any act which failure would, interfere with the Temporary Monitor's taking custody, control, possession, or management of the immigration services forms and supporting documents subject to this Order; or harassing or interfering with the Temporary Monitor in any way; or interfering in any manner with the exclusive jurisdiction of this Court over immigration forms and supporting documents; or refusing to cooperate with the Temporary Monitor or his duly authorized agents in the exercise of their duties or authority under any Order of this Court; and
- G. Filing, or causing to be filed, any petition on behalf of any Defendant for relief under the United States Bankruptcy Code, 11 U.S.C. §§ 101-1330 (2002), without

prior permission from this Court.

XIII. Delivery of Immigration Services Forms and Supporting Documents IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

- A. Immediately upon service of this Order upon them, or within such period as may be permitted by the Temporary Monitor, Defendants or any other person shall transfer or deliver possession, custody, and control of the following to the Temporary Monitor:
 - 1. All immigration forms and supporting documents of the Defendants, including but not limited to, books and records of accounts, legal files (whether held by Defendants or their counsel), all financial and accounting records, balance sheets, income statements, bank records (including monthly statements, canceled checks, records of wire transfers, and check registers), client lists, title documents, and other papers;
 - 2. All of Defendants' accounting records, tax records, and tax returns controlled by, or in the possession of, any bookkeeper, accountant, enrolled agent, licensed tax preparer, or certified public accountant;
 - 3. All loan applications made by or on behalf of Defendants and supporting documents held by any type of lender including, but not limited to, banks, savings and loans, thrifts, or credit unions; and
 - 4. All keys and codes necessary to gain or secure access to any assets or documents of Defendants including, but not limited to, access to their business premises, means of communication, accounts, computer systems,

or other property; and

B. In the event any person or entity fails to deliver or transfer any immigration form or supporting document or otherwise fails to comply with any provision of this Paragraph, the Temporary Monitor may file *ex parte* an Affidavit of Non-Compliance regarding the failure. Upon filing of the affidavit, in addition to other remedies available to the Temporary Monitor, the Court may authorize, without additional process or demand, Writs of Possession or Sequestration or other equitable writs requested by the Temporary Monitor. The writs shall authorize and direct the United States Marshal or any sheriff or deputy sheriff of any county, or any other federal or state law enforcement officer, to seize the document or other thing and to deliver it to the Temporary Monitor.

XIV. Collection of Defendants' Mail

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

- A. All Defendants are temporarily restrained and enjoined from opening mail addressed to the Defendants, including but not limited to, mail received at the following address:
 - 1. 10 North Calvert Street, Suite 700, Baltimore, Maryland; and
 - 2. Any other address used by any of the Defendants related to any immigration service;
- B. The Temporary Monitor is authorized to open all mail received at Defendants' business address(es) (The Temporary Monitor shall forward non-business mail, if any, to the Individual Defendant's last known personal address);

- C. Any funds related to any immigration service enclosed in any mail shall be maintained and accounted for by the Temporary Monitor until further order by the Court; and
- D. Any Defendant who receives mail or any delivery addressed to a Defendant related to any immigration service shall promptly deliver it unopened to the Temporary Monitor.

XV. Compensation of Temporary Monitor

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Temporary Monitor, and personnel hired by the Temporary Monitor to perform the duties under this Order, are entitled to a reasonable compensation for the performance of duties pursuant to this Order and for the cost of actual out-of-pocket expenses incurred by them, from the Defendants' assets. To obtain payment, the Temporary Monitor shall file with the Court and serve on the parties a request for compensation detailing fees and costs incurred. The Court shall grant the Temporary Monitor's request for compensation as it deems reasonable.

XVI. Temporary Monitor's Bond/Liability

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that no bond shall be required in connection with the appointment of the Temporary Monitor. Except for an act of gross negligence, the Temporary Monitor and his personnel shall not be liable for any loss or damage incurred by any of the Defendants, their officers, agents, servants, employees, attorneys, or any other person, by reason of any act performed or omitted to be performed by the Temporary Monitor or his personnel in connection with the discharge of his duties and responsibilities.

ADDITIONAL NOTIFICATION PROVISIONS

XVII. Service of Order

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that copies of this Order may be served by any means, including facsimile transmission, email, and overnight delivery service, upon any financial institution or other entity or person that may have possession, custody, or control of any documents or assets of any Defendant, or that may be subject to any provision of this Order. Pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 4(c)(2), this Order and the initial papers filed in this matter may be served on Defendants, upon the business premises of Defendants, and upon any financial institution or other entity or person that may have possession, custody, or control of any documents or assets of any of the Defendants, or that may be subject to any provision of this Order, by employees of the FTC, by employees of any other law enforcement agency, by any agent of Plaintiff FTC, or by any agent of any process service retained by Plaintiff FTC.

XVIII. Distribution of Order by Defendants

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants shall immediately provide a copy of this Order to each affiliate, sales entity, successor, assign, member, officer, employee, agent, servant, attorney, subsidiary, division, and representative of any of the Defendants, and shall, within three (3) days from the date of entry of this Order, provide the FTC with a sworn statement that Defendants have complied with this provision of the Order, which statement shall include the names and addresses of each such person or entity who received a copy of this Order.

XIX. Expedited Discovery

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 30(a), 31(a), 34, and 45, and notwithstanding the provisions of Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 26(d)

and (f), 30(a)(2)(A), and 31(a)(2)(A), Plaintiff FTC is granted leave, at any time after entry of this Order to:

- A. Take the deposition of any person or entity, whether or not a party, for the purpose of discovering the nature, location, status, and extent of the assets of Defendants, and Defendants' affiliates and subsidiaries; the nature and location of documents reflecting the immigration services business transactions of Defendants, and Defendants' affiliates and subsidiaries; the location of any premises where Defendants, directly or through any third party, conduct business operations; the Defendants' whereabouts; and/or the applicability of any evidentiary privileges to this action; and
- B. Demand the production of documents from any person or entity, whether or not a party, relating to the nature, status, and extent of the assets of Defendants, and Defendants' affiliates and subsidiaries; the nature and location of documents reflecting the immigration services business transactions of Defendants, and Defendants' affiliates and subsidiaries; the location of any premises where Defendants, directly or through any third party, conduct business operations; the Defendants' whereabouts; and/or the applicability of any evidentiary privileges to this action.

Three (3) days notice shall be deemed sufficient for any such deposition, five (5) days notice shall be deemed sufficient for the production of any such documents, and twenty-four (24) hours notice shall be deemed sufficient for the production of any such documents that are maintained or stored only as electronic data. The provisions of this Section shall apply both to

parties to this case and to non-parties. The limitations and conditions set forth in Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2)(B) and 31(a)(2)(B) regarding subsequent depositions of an individual shall not apply to depositions taken pursuant to this Section. Any such depositions taken pursuant to this Section shall not be counted toward any limit on the number of depositions under the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure, including those set forth in Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2)(A) and 31(a)(2)(A) or the Local Rules of Civil Procedure for the United States District Court for the District of Maryland. Service of discovery upon a party, taken pursuant to this Section, shall be sufficient if made through the means described in Section XXI of this Order.

XX. Consumer Reporting Agencies

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Section 604 of the Fair Credit Reporting Act, 15 U.S.C. § 1681b, any consumer reporting agency may furnish a consumer or credit report concerning any Defendant to Plaintiff FTC.

PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION PROCEEDINGS

XXI. Order to Show Cause

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(b), Defendants shall appear before this Court, located at United States District Court for the Northern District of Maryland, Baltimore Division, 101 West Lombard Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21201, on the 14th day of June, 2011, at 10:00 o'clock a.m., to show cause why this Court should not enter a preliminary injunction, pending final ruling on the Complaint, against Defendants enjoining them from violations of Section 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(a), imposing additional

relief as may be appropriate, and continue the appointment of the Temporary Monitor over Defendants.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, in support of its application for a preliminary injunction, Plaintiff FTC may submit supplemental evidence discovered subsequent to the filing of its application for a TRO, as well as a supplemental memorandum. Plaintiff FTC shall file and serve any supplemental evidence and memorandum by no later than 4:30 p.m. on the third court day prior to the preliminary injunction hearing as scheduled above. The documents may be served on each Defendant by emailing, faxing, or delivering the document(s) to the attorney(s) for the Defendants, or, if the Defendants are not represented by counsel, to a fax number or email address previously designated by the Defendants in writing to counsel for Plaintiff FTC; if the Defendants have not so designated a fax number or email address, service may be effected by mailing the documents to an address designated in writing by the Defendants to counsel for Plaintiff FTC; if no address has been so designated, service shall be complete upon filing of the documents with this Court.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants shall file and serve any opposition to the issuance of a preliminary injunction and the appointment of a permanent monitor over the Defendants, including any declarations, exhibits, memoranda or other evidence on which they intend to rely, and objections to any evidence submitted by Plaintiff FTC, by no later than 4:30 p.m. of the fourth court day prior to the hearing on the preliminary injunction. Such documents may be served by email or fax upon Plaintiff FTC's counsel.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Plaintiff FTC shall file and serve any reply to Defendants' opposition by no later than the second court day prior to the preliminary injunction hearing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that service on the FTC shall be performed by delivery to:

XXII. Examination of Witnesses

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the preliminary injunction hearing will be conducted on the papers served and filed by the parties and on oral argument by counsel. No live witness testimony will be heard.

XXIII. Expiration Date of Temporary Restraining Order

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Temporary Restraining Order shall expire on June 14, 2011, at 5:00 p.m. (EDT), unless before such time the Order is extended for good cause shown, or by consent of the parties.

XXIV. Retention of Jurisdiction

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court shall retain jurisdiction of this matter for all purposes.

XXV. Defendant's Right to Seek Rescission or Revision

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order is without prejudice to the right of

Defendants and/or other person(s) having standing to file a motion seeking rescission or revision

of the instant Order requesting a prompt hearing on said motion.

- (3) "in any (... statement under penalty of perjury as permitted under section 1746 of title 28, United States Code) in any proceeding before or ancillary to any court or grand jury of the United States knowingly makes any false material declaration or makes or uses any other information . . . knowing the same to contain any false material declaration" (18 U.S.C. § 1623).

For a felony conviction under the provisions cited above, federal law provides that the fine may be not more than the greater of (i) \$250,000 for an individual or \$500,000 for a corporation, or (ii) if the felony results in pecuniary gain to any person or pecuniary loss to any person other than the defendant, the greater of twice the gross gain or twice the gross loss. 18 U.S.C. § 3571.
