ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION AND REVISING SCHEDULING ORDER

On September 29, 2015,¹ the parties filed a Corrected Joint Motion for Extension of Upcoming Scheduling Order Deadlines. The parties represent that the extension is requested in order to provide adequate time for the parties to fully evaluate the September 24, 2015 Opinion and Order Denying Plaintiff's Motion for Preliminary Injunction in *FTC v. STERIS Corp.*, et al., No. 15-cv-1080-DAP (N.D. Ohio).

The parties have not previously sought any extensions to other deadlines in the Scheduling Order, issued June 30, 2015. None of the requested modifications to the Scheduling Order would affect the date on which the hearing is scheduled to begin. The parties have demonstrated good cause for the requested extensions. Accordingly, the Joint Motion is GRANTED.

However, two of the requested deadlines fall on a federal holiday. In addition, the proposed change to the deadline to provide notice to opposing parties or non-parties for whom parties intend to offer confidential materials at the hearing affects deadlines for filing motions for *in camera* treatment and responses thereto. Accordingly, the remaining deadlines are revised as follows:

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| | | Respondents' Counsel serves courtesy copies on ALJ its final proposed witness and exhibit lists, its basis of admissibility for each proposed exhibit, and a brief summary of the testimony of each witness, including its expert witnesses. |
| October 13, 2015 | ·- | Parties that intend to offer confidential materials of an opposing party or non-party as evidence at the hearing must provide notice to the opposing party or non-party, pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 3.45(b). See Additional Provision 6. |
| October 13, 2015 | - | Complaint Counsel to identify rebuttal expert(s) and provide rebuttal expert report(s). Any such reports are to be limited to rebuttal of matters set forth in Respondents' expert reports. If material outside the scope of fair rebuttal is presented, Respondents will have the right to seek appropriate relief (such as striking Complaint Counsel's rebuttal expert reports or seeking leave to submit surrebuttal expert reports on behalf of Respondents). |

October 23, 2015 Respondents' Counsel files pretrial brief supported by legal authority.

October 26, 2015 By 1:00 p.m., file final stipulations of law, facts, and authenticity.

Any subsequent stipulations may be offered as agreed by the

parties.

October 27, 2015 Final prehearing conference to begin at 10:00 a.m. in FTC Courtroom, Room 532, Federal Trade Commission Building, 600

Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20580.

The parties are to meet and confer prior to the conference regarding trial logistics and proposed stipulations of law, facts,

and authenticity of exhibits.

To the extent the parties stipulate to certain issues, the parties shall prepare a Joint Exhibit which lists the agreed stipulations.

Counsel may present any objections to the final proposed witness lists and exhibits. Trial exhibits will be admitted or excluded to the extent practicable. To the extent the parties agree to the admission of each other's exhibits, the parties shall prepare a Joint Exhibit which lists the exhibits to which neither side objects. Any Joint Exhibit will be signed by each party. (Do not

include a signature line for the ALJ.)
