

On February 24, 2009, Respondents submitted a Motion to Dismiss For Lack of Jurisdiction and Violation of Respondents' Constitutional Rights and Memorandum in Support. Complaint Counsel submitted its Memorandum in Opposition to the Motion on March 6, 2009. On February 24, 2009, Respondents submitted a Motion for Summary Decision and Memorandum in Support. On March 20, 2009, an order was issued setting an evidentiary hearing and oral argument to determine jurisdiction under section 4 of the FTC Act. 15 U.S.C. § 44. Accordingly, the motions shall be held in abeyance until after the conclusion of the hearing on jurisdiction and order thereon.
