**ORDER GRANTING COMPLAINT COUNSEL’S UNOPPOSED  
MOTION TO AMEND SCHEDULING ORDER**

On November 17, 2022, Federal Trade Commission Complaint Counsel filed an Unopposed Motion to Amend the Scheduling Order (“Unopposed Motion”). Pursuant to Rule 3.21(c)(2), the Administrative Law Judge may grant a motion to extend any deadline or time specified in the Scheduling Order, other than the date of the evidentiary hearing, upon a showing of good cause. 16 C.F.R. § 3.21(c)(2).

On September 9, 2022, the Commission ordered that “the evidentiary hearing in this proceeding [. . . ] will be conducted virtually by video conference[.]” Commission Order Directing Further Proceedings and Specifying Facts Without Substantial Controversy at 1. On September 19, 2022, the Commission postponed the evidentiary hearing in this matter to February 22, 2023, and directed that “unless modified by the Chief Administrative Law Judge, all related prehearing deadlines” be extended by three months. Commission Order Granting Complaint Counsel’s Expedited Motion to Continue Evidentiary Hearing Date and Prehearing Deadlines. Complaint Counsel proposes to amend the Scheduling Order to clarify all prehearing deadlines and to integrate all prior amendments to the Additional Provisions included therein.

Upon review and consideration of the Unopposed Motion, good cause exists and the Unopposed Motion is GRANTED. It is further ORDERED that the Amended Scheduling Order is issued herewith.
