Plaintiff Federal Trade Commission ("Commission" or "FTC"), pursuant to § 13(b) of the Federal Trade Commission Act ("FTC Act"), 15 U.S.C. § 53(b), filed a complaint for permanent injunction and other relief and applied *ex parte* for a Temporary Restraining Order with Asset Freeze and Other Relief, and an Order to Show Cause Why a Preliminary Injunction Should Not Issue, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65.

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3		FINDINGS OF FACT
4		We have considered the pleadings, declarations, exhibits, and memoranda filed in
5	suppor	rt of the Commission's application. On the record as it exists to this point, we
6		the following findings of fact:
7	1.	We have subject matter jurisdiction over this case, and there is good cause to
8		believe we will have jurisdiction over all parties.
9	2.	There is good cause to believe venue lies properly within this Court.
10	3.	There is good cause to believe that Defendants Group C Marketing, Inc., ("Group
11		C") and Satinderjit Singh Chadha ("Chadha") have engaged in and are likely to
12		continue to engage in acts and practices that violate § $5(a)$ of the FTC Act, 15
13		U.S.C. § 45(a), and that the Commission is likely to prevail on the merits of this
14	i i i i i i i i i i i i i i i i i i i	action.
15	4.	There is good cause to believe that immediate and irreparable harm will result
16		from the Defendants' ongoing violations of § 5(a) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C.
17		§ 45(a) absent entry of this Temporary Restraining Order (TRO).
18	5.	There is good cause to believe that immediate and irreparable damage to the
19		Court's ability to grant effective final relief for consumers, in the form of
20	i.	monetary restitution, will occur from the sale, transfer, assignment, or other
21		disposition or concealment by Defendants of their assets or records unless
22		Defendants are immediately restrained and enjoined by order of this Court.
23	6.	There is good cause to believe that Defendants have a history of violating
24		administrative orders, and that persons similar to Defendants have a history of
25		disposing of evidence and assets.
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- There is good cause for issuing this Order without prior notice to the Defendants
 of the Commission's application, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure
 65(b).
- 4 8. Weighing the equities and considering the Commission's likelihood of success in
 5 its cause of action, this TRO is in the public interest.
- 6 9. No security is required of any agency of the United States for issuance of a restraining order. Fed. R. Civ. P. 65(c).

ORDER

Definitions

- 1. "Assets" means any legal or equitable interest in, right to, or claim to, any real or
 personal property, including but not limited to chattel, goods, instruments,
 equipment, fixtures, general intangibles, effects, leaseholds, mail, or other
 deliveries, inventory, checks, notes, accounts, available credit, through credit card
 accounts or otherwise, receivables (as those terms are defined in the Uniform
 Commercial Code), and all cash, wherever located.
- 16 2. "Defendants" means Defendants Group C, and Chadha, and each of them, bywhatever name each might be known.
- 18 3. "Document" is synonymous in meaning and equal in scope to the usage of the
 19 term in Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 34(a).
- 4. "Work-at-Home Opportunity" means any program, plan, product, or service that
 claims to enable a participant or purchaser to earn money by working at home.
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I. PROHIBITED BUSINESS ACTIVITIES

It is therefore ORDERED that, immediately following service of this Order,
Defendants, as well as their successors, assigns, officers, agents, directors, servants,
employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, corporations, subsidiaries,
branches or business divisions, and all other persons or entities in active concert or

participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or
 otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation subsidiary, division, or
 other entity, are hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

- Falsely representing, expressly or by implication, that consumers will make a
 substantial amount of money by participating in Defendants' envelope-stuffing
 business opportunity;
- 7 2. Falsely representing, expressly or implicitly, that Defendants will pay consumers who participate in Defendants' envelope-stuffing business for stuffing envelopes;
 9 3. Falsely representing or representing without adequate substantiation, expressly or implicitly, the earnings potential of any Work-at-Home business opportunity being promoted.

II. ASSET FREEZE

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It is further ORDERED that, immediately following service of this Order,
Defendants as well as their successors, assigns, officers, agents, directors, servants,
employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys, corporations, subsidiaries,
branches or business divisions, and all other persons or entities in active concert or
participation with them who receive actual notice of this Order by personal service or
otherwise, whether acting directly or through any corporation subsidiary, division, or
other entity, are hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from:

 Except as otherwise ordered herein, transferring, converting, encumbering, selling, concealing, dissipating, disbursing, assigning, spending, withdrawing, transferring control of, such as by removing a Defendant's name as a signatory from an account, or otherwise disposing of any assets, wherever located, that are a) owned or controlled by any or all Defendants in whole or in part, b) in the actual or constructive possession of any or all Defendants, or c) owned, controlled by, or in the actual or constructive possession of any corporation, partnership, or other

entity directly or indirectly owned, managed, or controlled by, or under common 1 control with any or all Defendants. This Section shall include, but not be limited to, any assets held for, on behalf of, for the benefit of, or by Defendants, or their affiliates or subsidiaries, at any bank or savings and loan institution, or with any broker, dealer, escrow agent, title company, commodity trading company, precious metal dealer, merchant account, processor, or other financial institution or 6 depository of any kind, including without limitation any assets at Vineyard Bank 7 (formerly Rancho Bank) including a) the former Rancho Bank account ending in 8 -1835 in the name of HBG Publications, and b) the former Rancho Bank account 9 ending in -0022 in the name of Summit Group Publications. 10

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Opening or causing to be opened any safe deposit boxes or storage facilities titled 11 2. in the name of any or all Defendants or subject to access by any or all Defendants 12 or under their control, without providing the Commission prior notice and an 13 opportunity to inspect the contents in order to determine whether they contain 14 assets covered by this Section. 15

This Section shall apply to assets that Defendants acquire following entry of this Order only if such assets are derived from the operation of any activity prohibited by this Order.

III. FINANCIAL REPORTS

It is further ORDERED that, within three (3) business days following service of this Order, Defendant Group C shall complete and deliver to counsel for the Commission the "Financial Statement of Corporate Defendant" that is attached to this Order as Attachment 1.

IV. FOREIGN ASSETS

It is further ORDERED that, within three (3) business days following the service of this Order, Defendant Group C shall provide the Commission with a full accounting of all the funds, documents, and assets outside the United States which are a) titled in its

name, individually or jointly, b) held by any person or entity for the its benefit, or c)
 under its direct or indirect control, whether jointly or singly.

- It is further ORDERED that, within three (3) business days following the service
 of this Order, each Defendant shall:
- Transfer to the territory of the United States all funds, documents, and assets
 located in foreign countries which are a) titled in the name individually or jointly
 or any Defendant, b) held by any person or entity for the benefit of any Defendant,
 or c) under any Defendant's direct or indirect control, whether jointly or singly;
 and

Sign, and provide the Commission with, the Consent to Release of Financial
Records attached to this Order as Attachment 2.

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V. INTERFERENCE WITH REPATRIATION

It is further ORDERED that Defendants are hereby temporarily restrained and
enjoined from taking any action, directly or indirectly, which may result in the
encumbrance or dissipation of foreign assets, or in the hindrance of the repatriation
required by Section IV of this Order, including but not limited to:

- Sending any statement, letter, fax, e-mail, or wire transmission, telephoning or
 engaging in any other act, directly or indirectly, that results in a determination by
 foreign trustee or other entity that a "duress" event has occurred under the terms of
 a foreign trust agreement, until such time that all assets have been fully repatriated
 pursuant to Section IV of this Order; and
- Notifying any trustee, protector, or other agent of any foreign trust or other related
 entities of either the existence of this Order, or the fact that repatriation is required
 pursuant to a Court Order, with the intent or knowledge of substantial likelihood
 that such notification will hinder or interfere with repatriation.

VI. PRESERVATION OF RECORDS

It is further ORDERED that Defendants as well as their successors, assigns,
officers, agents, directors, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors,

attorneys, corporations, subsidiaries, branches or business divisions, and all other 1 persons or entities in active concert or participation with them who receive actual notice 2 of this Order by personal service or otherwise, whether acting directly or through any 3 corporation subsidiary, division, or other entity, are hereby temporarily restrained and 4 enjoined from destroying, erasing, mutilating, concealing, altering, transferring, or 5 otherwise disposing of, in any manner, directly or indirectly, any documents that relate to 6 the business practices, business finances or personal finances of Defendants and any 7 business or entity owned or controlled, in whole or in part, directly or indirectly, by 8 Defendants. 9

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VII. REQUIRED DISTRIBUTION OF ORDER BY DEFENDANTS

It is further ORDERED that, within three (3) business days following service of 11 this Order, Defendants shall provide a copy of this Order to every possible affiliate, 12 partner, division, sales entity, successor, assign, employee, independent contractor, 13 agent, attorney, spouse, and representative, of Defendants, and SHALL, within ten (10) 14 days from the date of entry of this Order, file with this Court and serve upon counsel for 15 the Commission a sworn statement that they have complied with this provision of the 16 Order. This statement shall include the names and street addresses of each such person 17 or entity who received a copy of the Order, as well as the names and last known 18 addresses for each such person or entity for whom service was not possible and a 19 20 justification therefor.

VIII. RETENTION OF MAIL

It is further ORDERED that any person, entity, or commercial mail receiving
agency, including that entity located at 20651 Golden Springs Drive, Diamond Bar,
California 91789, who is receiving mail on behalf of any of the Defendants or that is
addressed to "HBG Publications" is hereby temporarily restrained and enjoined from
releasing any such mail to the Defendants or their successors, assigns, officers, agents,
directors, servants, employees, salespersons, independent contractors, attorneys,
corporations, subsidiaries, branches or business divisions, and all other persons or

entities in active concert or participation with them. Such person or entity shall
 safeguard and maintain such mail in their possession. The Commission's representatives
 shall be allowed to examine the items received and make copies of the outside of the
 envelopes.

IX. DUTIES OF ASSET HOLDERS

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It is further ORDERED that, effective upon actual notice of this Order, any bank, 6 savings and loan institution, credit union, financial institution, brokerage house, escrow 7 agent, money market, mutual fund, title company, commodity trading company, common 8 carrier, storage company, trustee, commercial mail receiving agency, mail holding or 9 forwarding company, or any other partnership, corporation, or legal entity, business 10 entity, or person, including but not limited to Vineyard Bank ("Asset Holder"), that 11 holds, controls, or maintains custody of any account or asset belonging to or titled in the 12 name of any Defendant or belonging to or titled in the name of any corporation, 13 partnership, or other entity known to such Asset Holder to be directly or indirectly 14 owned, managed, or controlled by, in whole or in part, any Defendant, or to which they 15 are a signatory, or which is known to such Asset Holder to be held on behalf of, or for 16 the benefit of, any Defendant, individually or jointly, or that has held, controlled or 17 maintained custody of any such account or asset at any time since June 3, 2004, shall: 18

Prohibit Defendants and their agents, servants, employees, attorneys, and all
 persons or entities directly or indirectly under their control, or in common control
 with them, from withdrawing, removing, assigning, transferring, pledging,
 encumbering, disbursing, dissipating, converting, selling, transferring control of,
 such as by removing a Defendant's name as a signatory from an account, or
 otherwise disposing of any such account or asset except:

a. As directed by further Order of the Court; or

b. By written agreement of the Commission and the parties claiming an interest in such account or asset;

EXPEDITED DISCOVERY 12 It is further ORDERED that, pursuant to Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 30(a), 13 31(a), 34, and 45, the Commission is granted leave at any time after service of this 14 15 Order: To take the deposition, including depositions upon forty-eight (48) hours' written 16 1. notice, of any person, whether or not a party, for the purpose of discovering the 17 nature, location, status, and extent of assets of Defendants; the nature and location 18 of documents reflecting the business transactions of Defendants; and the 19 whereabouts of Defendants. The limitations and conditions set forth in Federal 20 Rules of Civil Procedure 30(a)(2)(B) and 31(a)(2)(B) regarding subsequent 21 depositions of an individual shall not apply to depositions taken pursuant to this 22 Section. Any such depositions taken pursuant to this Section shall not be counted 23 toward the ten deposition limit set forth in Federal Rules of Civil Procedure 24 30(a)(2)(A) and 31(a)(2)(A); and 25 To demand the production of documents, on forty-eight (48) hours' notice, from 26 2. any person, whether or not a party, relating to the nature, status, or extent of 27 Defendants' assets, or of their affiliates or subsidiaries; the location of documents 28

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reflecting the business transactions of Defendants; and the whereabouts of Defendants.

XII. ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE RE: PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

It is further **ORDERED**, pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 65(b) and Local Rule 65-1, Defendants shall appear before this Court in Courtroom 650 of the United States District Court, located at 255 East Temple Street, Los Angeles, California 90012 on October 10, 2006, at 1:30 P.M. (PDT), to **SHOW CAUSE**, if any, why we should not enter a preliminary injunction pending final judgment on the Complaint.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Commission **SHALL** serve and file a memorandum of points and authorities based on evidence acquired subsequent to the filing of its Complaint by no later than 4:00 P.M. (PDT) on October 2, 2006. The Commission **SHALL** leave a courtesy copy of this memorandum in the bin outside Chambers, located in room 660, **AT THE SAME TIME** it is filed.

It is further **ORDERED** that Defendants, jointly or individually, **SHALL** serve and file Memoranda in Opposition, together with all declarations and other evidence upon which they intend to rely at the preliminary injunction hearing, by no later than 4:00 P.M. (PDT) on October 5, 2006. The Defendants **SHALL** leave a courtesy copy of all memoranda, evidence, or other documents in the bin outside Chambers, located in room 660, **AT THE SAME TIME** it is filed.

It is further **ORDERED** that the Commission **SHALL** serve and file a Reply Memorandum by no later than 4:00 P.M. (PDT) on October 6, 2006. This Reply **SHALL** be limited to argument and/or authorities responsive to the opposition papers. The Commission **SHALL** leave a courtesy copy of this Reply in the bin outside Chambers, located in room 660, **AT THE SAME TIME** it is filed.

XIII. SERVICE

It is further **ORDERED** that:

27 1. Service of, or pursuant to, this Order may be made by any means, including
28 facsimile.

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For purposes of service on anyone in possession of records, assets, property, or
 property rights, actual notice of this Order shall be deemed complete upon
 notification by any means, including but not limited to facsimile transmission of
 this Order, without Attachments.

Notwithstanding the fact that this case is under seal until September 29, 2006, at
9:30 A.M., the Commission may immediately serve this Order for any reason set
forth herein.

8 4. Service on opposing parties of the papers described in Section XII SHALL be by
9 hand or by fax on the day and at the time of filing.

XIV. DURATION

It is further **ORDERED** that the TRO granted herein shall expire ten (10) court days after entry, on October 10, 2006, unless, within such time, for good cause shown, it is extended for a like period, or unless the Defendants consent, in writing, that it may be extended for a longer period. The reasons for any extension **SHALL** be entered on the record.

XV. RETENTION OF JURISDICTION

It is further **ORDERED** that we shall retain jurisdiction over this matter in order to enforce this TRO.

(2) "in any . . . statement under penalty of perjury as permitted under section 1746 of title 28, United States Code, willfully subscribes as true any material matter which he does not believe to be true" (18 U.S.C. § 1621); or

(3) "in any (... statement under penalty of perjury as permitted under section 1746 of title 28, United States Code) in any proceeding before or ancillary to any court or grand jury of the United States knowingly makes any false material declaration or makes or uses any other information ... knowing the same to contain any false material declaration." (18 U.S.C. § 1623)

For a felony conviction under the provisions cited above, federal law provides that the fine may be not more than the greater of (i) \$250,000 for an individual or \$500,000 for a corporation, or (ii) if the felony results in pecuniary gain to any person or pecuniary loss to any person other than the defendant, the greater of twice the gross gain or twice the gross loss. 18 U.S.C. § 3571.
