
**ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION OF NON-PARTIES HEWLETT-  
PACKARD COMPANY AND DAVID DONATELLI FOR EXTENSION OF TIME  
TO MOVE TO LIMIT OR QUASH SUBPOENA *AD TESTIFICANDUM***

On June 3, 2010, non-parties Hewlett-Packard Company (“HP”) and David Donatelli (“Donatelli”) (collectively, the “Non-parties”) submitted an Unopposed Motion for Extension of Time, seeking an extension of the time permitted to move to limit or quash a subpoena *ad testificandum* issued to Donatelli by Respondent Intel Corporation.

The Non-parties state that HP accepted service of the subpoena on May 28, 2010, and that, under the Commission’s Rules of Practice, the time for the Non-parties to submit a motion to limit or quash the subpoena would expire on June 7, 2010. The Non-parties seek an extension of time until June 9, 2010, so the parties may try to reach agreement regarding the subpoena, and state that Respondent does not oppose such extension.

Based on the foregoing, the Non-parties’ motion for extension of time is GRANTED, and it is hereby ORDERED that the Non-parties shall have until June 9, 2010 to file a motion to limit or quash the subpoena *ad testificandum* to Donatelli served by Respondent on May 28, 2010.
