Agreement and Stipulation for Order Dismissing Petition for Protective Order and Stay of Disclosure of Confidential Information

WHEREAS, Petitioner Star Pipe Products, Ltd. ("Star"), pursuant to 15 U.S.C. § 57b-2(c)(3), and 16 C.F.R. § 4.10(g), has petitioned this Court for an order of protection and stay of disclosure of certain documents obtained from Star by Respondent, the Federal Trade Commission ("FTC" or "Commission"), in the course of an investigation, FTC File No. 101-0080, and that Star has marked or designated as confidential ("Confidential Documents");

WHEREAS, Star filed this Petition after receiving notices from FTC staff that staff intended to show the Confidential Documents to a third party witness, Mr. Matthew Minamyer, in the course of an FTC investigational hearing conducted pursuant to Part 2 of the FTC's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. §§ 2.1-2.51;

WHEREAS, FTC staff conducted an investigational hearing of Mr. Minamyer on November 9, 2011, but did not show him or communicate to him the Confidential Documents;

WHEREAS, the possibility of the FTC's recalling Mr. Minamyer to testify regarding the Confidential Documents was discussed among the parties, but the testimony was never scheduled;

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WHEREAS, on January 4, 2012, the Commission issued an administrative adjudicative complaint against Star and other defendants, pursuant to Section 5 of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45;

WHEREAS, any future disclosure by the FTC to Mr. Minamyer of the Confidential Documents in the administrative litigation would be governed by Part 3 of the Commission's Rules of Practice, which include provisions by which a party may obtain a protective order to limit or prevent disclosure of confidential information, see 16 C.F.R. § 3.31(d) & App. A;

NOW THEREFORE, Star and the FTC stipulate and agree as follows:

Issuance of an administrative complaint has rendered moot the FTC's need for future testimony from Mr. Minamyer under Part 2 of the Commission's Rules of Practice;

The notices provided to Star by FTC staff on November 7 and November 8, 2011, pursuant to Rule 4.10(f) of the FTC's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 4.10(f), are hereby withdrawn;

If Commission staff intends to disclose the Confidential Documents in connection with any future investigational hearing of Mr. Minamyer pursuant to Part 2 of the FTC's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. §§ 2.1-2.51, Staff will provide Star with a new notice pursuant to Rule 4.10(f), 16 C.F.R. § 4.10(f);

This stipulation and consequent dismissal of this proceeding (and Star's similar proceeding before the FTC): (1) in no way relates to, amends, affects, or alters the treatment, use, or disclosure of Star's nonpublic information in any proceeding under the FTC's Part 3 Rules, 16 C.F.R. §§ 3.1-3.83; and (2) in no way waives or relinquishes any rights Star may have as to the confidentiality of its documents under 16 C.F.R. §§ 4.10-4.11, 15 U.S.C. §§ 46(f) and 57b-2(f), 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(3)-(4), and/or other applicable law; and

This proceeding is hereby dismissed without prejudice as moot.
