## ORDER DENYING COMPLAINT COUNSEL'S REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED BRIEFING

On April 4, 2012, Complaint Counsel filed a Motion to Compel Respondent McWane, Inc.'s Answers to Interrogatories Numbers 13 through 16 ("Motion"). In that Motion, Complaint Counsel requested an expedited briefing schedule and an order requiring Respondent's response to the Motion be filed no later than 5:00 pm on April 10, 2012.

Complaint Counsel filed its Motion pursuant to Commission Rule 3.38. That rule sets forth that any opposition to a motion to compel must be filed within 5 days of receipt of service of the motion and that the Administrative Law Judge shall rule on a motion to compel within 3 business days of the date on which the response is due. Pursuant to Commission Rules 3.38 and 4.3<sup>1</sup>, Respondent's Opposition is due no later than 5:00 pm on April 11, 2012. Therefore, the Commission's Rules of Practice require expedited briefing on motions to compel. Accordingly, Complaint Counsel's request to further expedite the briefing schedule is DENIED.
