The Federal Trade Commission's Bureau of Competition has been conducting a nonpublic investigation to determine whether the acquisition of the Warex terminals in Newburgh, New York by Global Companies LLC may violate Section 7 of the Clayton Act or Section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act.
