Dear Mr. Kinney:

We received your submissions on behalf of your client, Kochek Co., Inc. ("Kochek" or the "Company"). In correspondence and discussions, we identified broad statements in Kochek's marketing materials that could inadvertently mislead consumers about the extent to which the Company's products are made in the United States. Specifically, although Kochek makes some products in the United States, other products, including certain Storz products, contain significant imported content.

After receiving Commission staff's letter, you explained that Kochek implemented a remedial action plan to correct its representations. This plan included revising and adding qualifications to Kochek's marketing materials, adding qualifications to on-product branding, implementing a clear protocol for substantiating U.S.-origin claims, and increasing internal controls.

Based on the Company's statements, the staff has decided not to pursue this investigation any further. This action should not be construed as a determination that there was no violation of Section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45.
