DEFENDANTS IN CONTEMPT 13 APARTMENT HUNTERS, INC. et al., 14 Defendants. 15 16 17 The Court having considered Plaintiff's Ex Parte Application for Order to 18 Show Cause Why Defendants Should Not Be Held in Contempt, along with the 19 accompanying memorandum of points and authorities and exhibit filed in this matter, as well as any response by Defendants, and the proceedings conducted on 20 **&τ.** (Ο, 2018 pursuant to the Court's Order to Show Cause, and good cause 21 22 appearing, the Court orders the following: 23 IT IS ORDERED that Defendants Apartment Hunters, Inc., Real Estate 24 Data Solutions, Inc., Rental Home Listings Inc., UAB Apartment Hunters, Inc., 25 Steven Shayan, and Kevin Shayan ("Defendants") are held in CIVIL 26 CONTEMPT OF COURT for their violations of the Court's Temporary 27 Restraining Order ("TRO"). (Doc. No. 14). 28

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants comply with the terms of 1 2 the TRO by 5:00 pm Pacific Time on the day following the entry of the Court's 3 order finding Defendants in contempt. 4 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if Defendants do not purge his contempt by 5:00 pm Pacific Time on the day following the entry of this order, the 5 Court imposes a coercive civil contempt fine of \$1,000 per day of continued 6 noncompliance, payable to the United States through the Clerk of the Court for the 7 8 District of Central California. 9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants may purge their contempt by showing, by affidavit filed with the Court by 5:00 pm Pacific Time on the first 10 day after the Court enters its order, that Defendants, their agents, employees, and 11 any other persons in active concert or participation with them, have: 12 Ceased advertising, marketing, promoting, offering for sale, or 13 1) selling access to rental listings for properties that have been 14 approved for, accept, or purportedly accept any type of 15 16 government rent subsidy; and 17 Ceased, in connection with the advertising, marketing, 2) promoting, offering for sale or selling of subscriptions or access 18 to rental listings, using in any domain names, URLs for public-19 20 facing websites, keywords purchased to advertise Defendants' 21 services on search engines mobile applications, or business 22 names or aliases, any of the following terms: Section 8, 23 Voucher, Subsidized, Affordable housing, Low-income, Public 24 housing, Income-based, or Project-based. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any entity hosting any webpage or 25 website for any Defendant and any domain registrar, including, but not limited to eNom, Inc., who has provided or is providing domain name registration services on 28 any Defendant's website must
