

**ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION
TO AMEND SCHEDULING ORDER**

On June 17, 2015, the parties filed a Joint Motion to Amend the Scheduling Order (“Motion”), seeking an extension of the deadlines for (1) providing notices to parties and non-parties of an intent to offer confidential materials at the hearing, which notices are currently due by June 19, 2015; (2) filing motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits, currently due by June 29, 2015; and (3) responding to any *in camera* motions that are filed, currently due by July 6, 2015. The parties state that they are discussing proposals that will narrow the burden on third parties and the Court and will significantly reduce the time and expense that Respondents and the individual third parties would incur in filing motions for *in camera* treatment.

Pursuant to Rule 3.21(c)(2) of the FTC’s Rules of Practice, which governs the revision of scheduling order deadlines, the parties have demonstrated good cause for granting the requested extensions. No extensions of any other deadlines set by the Scheduling Order have been sought previously. Neither the hearing date in this matter, nor any other deadlines established by the Scheduling Order issued in this case, will be affected.

Accordingly, the Joint Motion is GRANTED. It is hereby ORDERED, that the March 16, 2015 Scheduling Order is amended as follows:

- June 29, 2015 Parties that intend to offer confidential materials of an opposing party or a nonparty as evidence at the hearing must provide notice to the opposing party or non-party, pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 3.45(b). *See* Additional Provision 7.
- July 9, 2015 Deadline for filing motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits.
- July 13, 2015 Deadline for filing responses to motions for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits. All other provisions of the March 16, 2015 Scheduling Order remain in effect.
