ORDER

Pursuant to the authority conferred by Sections 9, 16 and 20 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 49, 56, 57b-1, Petitioner, the Federal Trade Commission, has invoked the aid of this Court, pursuant to Fed. R. Civ. P. 81(a)(5), for an order requiring Respondent Clear Source Research, LLC to comply in full with the February 28, 2011 Civil Investigative Demand issued to it in aid of a law enforcement investigation being conducted by the Commission (FTC File No. 1023122).

The Court has considered the Commission's Petition for an Order to Enforce A Civil Investigative Demand and the papers filed in support thereof and it appears to the Court that Petitioner has shown good cause for the entry of this Order. Clear Source Research, LLC was properly served with this Court's Order to Show Cause on August 12, 2011. Clear Source has provided some limited information in the form of answers to Interrogatories, but did not respond to Specifications for Documentary Material. Clear Source also failed to submit any briefing, and did not appear at the Show Cause hearing held on August 23, 2011. It is by this Court hereby

ORDERED that Respondent Clear Source Research, LLC comply in full with the Commission's Civil Investigative Demand and produce, within twenty days of the date of service

of this Order, all responsive documents and information in compliance with the Civil Investigative Demand.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent must provide evidence to support any claim that it cannot comply because responsive documents or information were destroyed by the tornado affecting Joplin, Missouri, on May 22, 2011. The Court will not consider any such claim without supporting evidence or proof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a certified copy of this Order be served forthwith by Petitioner upon Respondent or its counsel by personal service, or by certified or registered mail with return receipt requested, or by overnight express delivery service.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
