**ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION  
TO EXTEND DISCOVERY SCHEDULE**

On June 16, 2017, Federal Trade Commission (“FTC” or “Commission”) Complaint Counsel and Respondent Impax laboratories, Inc. (“Respondent” or “Impax”) filed a Joint Motion to Extend the Discovery Schedule. FTC Rule 3.21(c)(2) provides that the Administrative Law Judge may, upon a showing of good cause, grant a motion to extend any deadline or time specified in this scheduling order other than the date of the evidentiary hearing. 16 C.F.R. § 3.21(c)(2).

The parties assert that in order to facilitate the resolution of a discovery dispute, Impax has agreed to substantially complete its document production by July 7, 2017. The parties further state that the Commission has extended the date for the evidentiary hearing by five weeks, from September 19, 2017 to October 24, 2017. Therefore, the parties state, a revised scheduling order should issue extending the remaining deadlines under the Scheduling Order issued on February 17, 2017 (“Scheduling Order”)<sup>1</sup> by five weeks, as set forth in the parties’ proposed revised scheduling order.

Based on the foregoing, the Joint Motion is GRANTED. A Revised Scheduling Order will be issued concurrently with this Order.
