ORDER ON SCHEIN’S SUPPLEMENT TO ITS RENEWED
MOTION FOR *IN CAMERA* TREATMENT

By Order dated October 30, 2018, the October 19 Motion for *In Camera* Treatment filed by Respondent Henry Schein, Inc. (“Schein”) (“October 19 Motion”) was denied in part without prejudice (“October 30 Order”). In its October 19 Motion, Schein sought *in camera* treatment for portions of 92 documents, stating that it is willing to redact the confidential information from these documents, but Schein had not identified the confidential information it sought to withhold from the public record. As permitted by the October 30 Order, on November 2, 2018, Schein filed a supplement, submitting a set of the 92 documents, with the proposed redactions.¹ Complaint Counsel, on November 5, 2018, filed a statement that, with one exception, it does not oppose the requested redactions. The document for which Complaint Counsel opposes *in camera*


¹ On November 6, 2018, Schein submitted six replacement partial *in camera* exhibits for RX2657, RX2470, RX2295, CX6598, CX4001, and CX2610 that contain additional minor redactions of confidential information, which were inadvertently omitted from the previous submission. Schein states that Complaint Counsel has stated that it has no objection to the additional redactions contained in the replacement *in camera* exhibits. These replacement exhibits are accepted.

treatment is identified as CX4092. By email dated November 5, 2018, Schein stated it is willing to withdraw its request for partial *in camera* treatment for CX4092.

Applying the standards for *in camera* treatment set forth in the October 11 Order, Schein's October 19 Motion, as supplemented by Schein's November 2 Supplement, is GRANTED.

In camera treatment for a period of five years, to expire on October 1, 2023, is GRANTED for the designated portions of the 91 documents remaining at issue, identified in Schein's October 19 Motion. Schein shall prepare a proposed order listing, by exhibit number, the documents that have been granted partial *in camera* treatment by this Order. The proposed order shall list only the exhibit numbers that have been granted partial *in camera* treatment and the length of time for which *in camera* treatment has been granted and need not include a description of the documents or the category under which a document falls.
