ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME

On September 28, 2020, non-party Perella Weinberg Partners LP (“PWP”) filed a Motion for Extension of Time to Move to Limit or Quash a Subpoena *Duces Tecum* (“Motion”) received by PWP from Federal Trade Commission (“FTC”) Complaint Counsel on September 17, 2020.

Under FTC Rule of Practice 3.34(c), any motion to limit or quash a subpoena must be filed within 10 days of receipt of the subpoena. 16 C.F.R. § 3.34(c). PWP seeks an extension until October 2, 2020. As grounds for the requested extension, PWP states that PWP’s counsel was out of the office on September 28, 2020 and that PWP’s counsel has scheduled a meet-and-confer with Complaint Counsel on September 29, 2020. PWP asserts that the requested extension will provide counsel with the opportunity to attempt to narrow or eliminate any disputes between PWP and Complaint Counsel regarding the subpoena. PWP represents that Complaint Counsel does not oppose the Motion.

FTC Rule 4.3(b) authorizes the Administrative Law Judge, except in circumstances not here presented, to extend any time limit prescribed by the rules “[f]or good cause shown.” 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b). Based on the representations in the Motion, PWP has demonstrated good cause for the requested extension. Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED and it is hereby ORDERED

that PWP's deadline for filing any motion to limit or quash the subpoena pursuant to Rule 3.34(c) is extended to October 2, 2020.
