We have been actively involved in our Quixtar (previously Amway) business for over 29 years and have not felt deceived in any way by the income projections that were presented to us.

When we share this opportunity with prospects we use the approved income representation material-SA-4400. We also inform prospects that there are no guarantees of success, but rather a chance for success with hard work and focus.

We have many IBO's who appear to be very please with their Quixtar experience (both in financial reward and in self fulfillment).

We are in favor of restrictions on illegal pyramid schemes that have hurt our industry. However, more than several of the proposed measures would absolutely cripple, if not totally devastate, this great business!

Specifically, a seven day waiting period would, in our experienced opinion totally devastate our sponsoring rate-which is already low.

Supplying a list of "references" to a prospect would also stall out almost all prospects, not to mention, invade the privacy of IBO's.

To be forced to provide a list of all legal allegations would make sponsoring someone (a task already difficult) totally impossible! Additionally this would give any of our competition added incentive to increase the flurry of frivolous law suits!

Additionally, to require IBO's to "calculate" and "substantiate" any and all income claims would require such additional effort and concern for error that most part time IBO's (which is almost all IBO's) would just throw up their hands and quit!

In my opinion, added restrictions that hinder Quixtar, and other legitimate businesses will not have the effect that you may hope on the illegal, fly by night, get-rich-quick schemes. It appears that they are already ignoring the current restrictions that should apply to their endeavors.

In short, Quixtar provides a viable income options for anyone who is willing to put in the required effort, and therefore is good for America and our economy. To add these proposed restrictions would effectively wipe out our way of doing business, but not the people who are willing to promote illegal, unethical business practices. What a shame that would be!
