

Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is being written to you because I am concerned about the proposed Business Opportunity Rule R511993. The BOR R511993 in its present form could prevent me from continuing as a Goldshield Elite Advanced Member (distributor). I understand that you want to protect the public from companies that have bad business practices, but some parts of the ruling will make it almost impossible if not impossible for me to continue to sell Goldshield Elite products! Not all companies are bad and putting us all together as bad apples is very wrong!

I do not understand at all the section about the seven-day waiting period to enroll new members. To be a Goldshield Elite Advanced Member (distributor), the cost is only \$29.95 for the first year and \$25.00 a year after that. You are penalizing Goldshield Elite and myself for other companies that are not on the up and up!!!! That is wrong. People buy all kinds of products everyday from all different kinds of businesses and they do not have to wait seven days. The next time you go to Wal-Mart would like it if you had to wait seven days to get your medication filled, oil changed and diapers for your baby! I think not! Because of this ridiculous waiting period, I will have to keep very detailed records when I speak with someone for the first time about Goldshield Elite and then I will have to send in way too many reports to Goldshield Elite headquarters. I will have to hire a secretary to keep up with all of this mess. My Goldshield Elite is supposed to be a home-based business parttime not a fulltime job that requires shuffling paper for most of the day.

The rule also calls for information to be released about lawsuits involving misrepresentation, or any wrong practices, even if the company was found not guilty!!! Why do we have to disclose lawsuits if Goldshield Elite is not found guilty!?!? That does not seem like very fair play on your part.

I do not at like the rule about the minimum 10 prior purchasers nearest to the person that is the new buyer. I am very uncomfortable about giving out information because of the

This creates more paper work for me, as I will have to get the list of the 10 people who purchased ahead of the new person from Goldshield Elite and then wait for Goldshield Elite to send me the list of people and their information! Also the sentence "If you buy a business opportunity from the seller, your contact information can be disclosed in the future to other buyers" is really ridiculous, no, it is just plain stupid. Would you want your information disclosed in the future to other buyers? I know I would not want my information disclosed so why would the people who purchase products from Goldshield Elite be any different than you or me?!?!?!?!?

I have been a Goldshield Elite Advanced Member for about 10 years. These natural products have given our family a better quality of health. So much so that I have stopped taking seven chemical drugs (I have allergies and asthmas for over 30 years) four inhalers, for my lungs, Claritin D, Singular and antibiotics. My husband was downsized in the year 2000 after 29 years on the job. We and thousands of other 50-year-old people had to start all over.
