


Licensing Trends for Certified Professional Midwives


In 1970 there were few laws licensing Direct Entry Midwives

AZ, NM, SC, DE




By 1990

◆ The Certified Professional Midwife credential was developed in the late 1980's and was first issued in 1994 by the North American Registry of Midwives.

◆ The Certified Professional Midwife credential is accredited by the National Commission for Certifying Agencies.

◆ Certified Professional Midwives are one of the fastest growing healthcare professions in the country with over 2000 certified.

◆ No state that has licensed Certified Professional Midwives has ever rescinded its program.

States adding Medicaid or other insurance mandates from 2010 - 2012: Idaho, Texas, Vermont.

States pushing in 2013 for CPM licensure or amendment of CPM statutes including Medicaid: Alabama, Arizona, California, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kentucky, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Mississippi, Nebraska, North Carolina, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Puerto Rico
