To Whom It May Concern,

From the very onset using ethanol in our fuels was a bad idea. Since it will be difficult to reverse due to the corn lobby and others, I would suggest making fuels without ethanol available on a limited scale for use in boats, motorcycles, off road vehicles, antiques, and aircraft. In some way the industry can force cars that are designed to use the blends to do so. The aircraft industry enforces regulations through insurance companies. If you have not followed the regulations on aircraft maintenance and you have an accident the aircraft is not covered. This includes not using the proper fuel. Likewise the auto industry could force the owners of cars to self police. You use the wrong fuel and you are not covered. But the pump must be clear about what the owner is pumping into his tank.
