

Dear Linda K. Badger or Matthew D. Gold;

regarding FTC vs Sony of America about the false advertising on the Playstation VITA:

i don't think the \$25 cash or \$50 voucher goes far enough. i think Sony and AT&T should be forced to unlock all the 3G Vitas. i don't think it's fair for them to keep sim locked on an exclusive agreement forever. i have asked both sides about the Vita and they tell me that it is confidential agreement . they have this push for the CITA to publish official unlocking policies that are effective on feb 2015, but they won't come clean on their special agreement. the iPhone was kept on AT&T for 5 years, and AT&T was quite open about the term of the exclusivity. the AT&T exclusive amazon fire phone can be unlocked. so why can't my Vita be unlocked?? i would like to put my Vita on T-Mobile. i paid full price for my vita. i deserve an unlock. if i need to subscribe for a data plan for 6 months to become eligible. then can AT&T please tell me? my last email to AT&T about the vita situation was never answered. when i ask sony , they wont give me an answer. when i look on the internet all i can find are hacking devices.

AT&T never wrote me back to the letter i sent them back in july.

when the newer vita "slim" came out , model PCH-2000, they replaced the OLED screen for a cheaper LCD screen. and replaced the charging port. but the one thing they did that upsets me is they dropped the 3G cellular function from the newer slim. this shows to me that sony has dropped 3G connectivity and has no more financial interest in it. furthermore the actual sony store has discontinued the 3G model and they no longer sell it. because of this, i think they should be forced to unlock the sim card and the contract between them and AT&T should be terminated.

i am writing you to personally ask you and the FTC if VITA unlocking can be added to the settlement.

Dear AT&T,

i would like to receive information about the AT&T exclusivity and any future unlock policies on the following items.

- 1) PLAYSTATION VITA 3G (PCH-1000 series). released to the united states on February 15, 2012. i believe this has been discontinued by sony.
- 2) Amazon Fire phone. (B00EOE0WKQ)

When the iPhone was released on June 29, 2007, AT&T and Apple were pretty straight forward that the exclusivity deal was for 5 years and the iPhone could only be used on their network. After the exclusivity ended, AT&T was very innovative and open in allowing all the iPhones to be unlocked. Yet i cant find any information from anywhere on the internet when i will be eligible to unlock my Playstation. I paid full price for this Playstation. I tried chatting Sony today and they told me they have no information. When will i be allowed to unlock my device ? Will the CITA unlocking rules that will be in effect in February 2015 allow me to unlock my Playstation ? will the bill s517 assumed to be signed by president obama have anything to do with AT&T unlocking these devices on request? or does s517 only make it legal to hack these devices to run on other networks ?

The CITA unlocking principles, which i have attached to this letter, and that has been reported that AT&T agreed to clearly state you are to fully disclose a policy on mobile device unlocking. but that unlocking information does not fully disclose the lengths of contacts on the "AT&T Exclusive" devices.

i would like you to fully disclose the termination dates of these "AT&T exclusive" devise and notify me and your customers after when these devices are paid for in full, can be unlocked and brought to other carriers.
