UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND SCHEDULING DEADLINES UNTIL JANUARY 9, 2024

Respondents IQVIA Holdings Inc. and Propel Media, Inc. jointly move to extend all scheduling deadlines in this proceeding until January 9, 2024, in light of the preliminary injunction recently entered in federal district court. Complaint Counsel does not oppose this motion.

On July 17, 2023, the FTC filed a Complaint for a Temporary Restraining Order and Preliminary Injunction in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York pursuant to Section 13(b) of the Federal Trade Commission Act. *See FTC v. IQVIA Holdings Inc.*, No. 1:23-cv-06188-ER, ECF No. 1 (S.D.N.Y. 2023). The district court held an evidentiary hearing on the FTC's preliminary injunction request from November 20 to December 1, 2023. On December 29, 2023, the district court granted the preliminary injunction. *See id.*, ECF No. 324. The Parties have filed a joint motion to withdraw based on

Extending the scheduling deadline for a brief period of time will preserve the resources of the parties, nonparties, and this Court, by avoiding possibly unnecessary waste associated with

imminent pretrial deadlines should the matter ultimately be withdrawn from adjudication or be dismissed prior to the evidentiary hearing. The parties and nonparties have several imminent deadlines starting today. Since Respondents do not propose to alter deadlines after January 16, 2024, this brief delay would not otherwise disrupt the schedule of the administrative proceedings.

Accordingly, Respondents respectfully propose that all deadlines be extended until January 9, 2024. Deadlines after January 12, 2024 would remain unchanged as reflected in the proposed amended scheduling order, attached as Exhibit A. All other provisions of this Court's scheduling orders would remain in place, except for the dates identified in Exhibit A.
