ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE TO QUASH OR LIMIT SUBPOENA

On April 22, 2024, non-party BJ's Wholesale Club, Inc. ("BJ's") filed a motion to extend its time to move to quash or limit or otherwise respond to the subpoena ("Subpoena") issued by Complaint Counsel on April 15, 2024 ("Motion"). Complaint Counsel does not oppose the relief requested in the Motion.

Under FTC Rule of Practice 3.34(c), any motion to limit or quash a subpoena must be filed within 10 days of receipt of the subpoena. 16 C.F.R. § 3.34(c). Pursuant to FTC Rule 4.3(b), the Administrative Law Judge, except in circumstances not here presented, may extend any time limit prescribed by the rules "[f]or good cause shown." 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b).

Based on the representations in the Motion, BJ's has demonstrated good cause for the requested extension. Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED and it is hereby ORDERED that BJ's deadline for filing any motion to quash or limit or otherwise respond to the Subpoena is extended to May 9, 2024.
