**ORDER GRANTING UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR FURTHER
EXTENSION OF TIME TO MOVE TO QUASH OR LIMIT SUBPOENA**

On May 31, 2024, non-party SpartanNash Company (“SpartanNash”) filed a motion to further extend its time to move to limit or quash or otherwise respond to the subpoena (“Subpoena”) issued by FTC Complaint Counsel on April 18, 2024 (“Motion”). Complaint Counsel does not oppose the relief requested in the Motion.

Under FTC Rule of Practice 3.34(c), any motion to limit or quash a subpoena must be filed within 10 days of receipt of the subpoena. 16 C.F.R. § 3.34(c). Pursuant to FTC Rule 4.3(b), the Administrative Law Judge, except in circumstances not here presented, may extend any time limit prescribed by the rules “[f]or good cause shown.” 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b).

Based on the representations in the Motion, SpartanNash has demonstrated good cause for the requested extension. Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED and it is hereby ORDERED that SpartanNash’s deadline for filing any motion to limit or quash or otherwise respond to the Subpoena is further extended to June 14, 2024.
