**ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO RESET BRIEFING DEADLINES**

On June 26, 2024, the parties filed a joint motion to stay the briefing deadlines set in the Order issued in this matter on June 5, 2024, in light of the negotiation and filing of a joint stipulation as to testimony given at the April 16, 2024 hearing before the Authority (“Joint Motion”).<sup>1</sup>

Pursuant to 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b)(1), good cause exists to extend the briefing deadlines and the Joint Motion is GRANTED. It is hereby ORDERED that the briefing schedule is modified as follows:

1. The parties shall file proposed findings of fact, proposed conclusions of law, a proposed order, and a supporting legal brief providing the party’s reasoning no later than August 12, 2024.
2. The parties shall file reply findings of fact and conclusions of law and supporting reply briefs no later than September 3, 2024.

It is further ORDERED that the parties shall confer and submit, no later than August 5, 2024, a joint Appeal Book containing the evidentiary record presented below, including without limitation all hearing video and transcripts, and all documentary and video exhibits.
