**ORDER GRANTING NON-PARTY NINTENDO OF AMERICA, INC.’S
REQUEST FOR EXPEDITED BRIEFING AND RULING**

On May 8, 2025, non-party Nintendo of America Inc. (“NOA”) filed a motion to extend the time for it to file a motion for *in camera* treatment of proposed trial exhibits by seven days (“Motion”), together with a request to expedite the deadlines for briefing and ruling on the Motion. NOA states that Complaint Counsel and Respondents’ counsel have indicated that they take no position on this relief.

FTC Rule of Practice 3.22 provides that responses to a motion are due within 10 days of service of the motion. 16 C.F.R. § 3.22(d). A ruling on a motion is then due within 14 days after the response is filed. 16 C.F.R. § 3.22(e). Under Rule 4.3(b), the Administrative Law Judge can shorten these time periods for good cause shown. 16 C.F.R. § 4.3(b).

Based on the representations in the Motion, NOA has demonstrated good cause for expediting the deadlines for briefing and ruling on the Motion. Accordingly, NOA’s request to expedite is GRANTED.

It is hereby ORDERED that responses to NOA’s Motion are due on May 13, 2025, and the ruling on the Motion shall issue shortly thereafter.
