ORDER GRANTING JOINT MOTION TO  
EXTEND DEADLINE FOR *IN CAMERA* MOTIONS

On May 12, 2025, Complaint Counsel and Respondents filed a Joint Motion to Extend Deadline for *In Camera* Motions by one week, to May 21, 2025 (“Motion”).

FTC Rule of Practice 3.21(c)(2) provides that the Administrative Law Judge may, upon a showing of good cause, grant a motion to extend any deadline or time specified in the scheduling order other than the date of the evidentiary hearing. 16 C.F.R. § 3.21(c)(2).

In the Motion, the parties state that they have filed with the Federal Trade Commission a joint motion seeking to change the hearing date to July 21, 2025 and to vacate current pretrial deadlines. The parties assert that granting a one-week extension will avoid unnecessarily burdening parties and nonparties.

Based on the representations in the Motion, the parties have demonstrated good cause for extending the deadline for *in camera* motions. Accordingly, the Motion is GRANTED.
