**Re: Duration of the Public Comment Period for Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking, Rule on Unfair or Deceptive Fees in Online Food Delivery Services, Matter No. P267101**

On April 14, 2026, the Commission voted to authorize publication of an advance notice of proposed rulemaking (“ANPRM”) in Matter No. P267101, Rule on Unfair or Deceptive Fees in Online Food Delivery Services. The ANPRM was published in the Federal Register on April 16, 2026, with a thirty-day comment period that ends on May 18, 2026. The Commission has received at least one request to extend the comment period for the ANPRM.

The ANPRM addresses potentially unfair or deceptive fee practices involving online food delivery platforms. The Commission previously sought and received comments relating to many of these practices in its rulemaking proceeding for the Trade Regulation Rule on Unfair or Deceptive Fees. That rulemaking began with an ANPRM published in November 2022 with an extended public comment period of 90 days, was followed by a notice of proposed rulemaking (“NPRM”) published in November 2023 with an extended public comment period of 90 days, and culminated in a final rule published on January 10, 2025. If the Commission decides to proceed with an NPRM concerning a Rule on Unfair or Deceptive Fees in Online Food Delivery Services, there will be a public comment period for the NPRM. Upon consideration of these facts, the Commission declines to extend the period for public comment on its ANPRM.

The Commission continues to welcome public comment on its ANPRM through the allotted comment period, which closes on May 18, 2026.
