**STIPULATED FINAL  
JUDGMENT  
AND ORDER FOR PERMANENT  
INJUNCTION AND CIVIL  
PENALTY**

Plaintiff, the Federal Trade Commission (“Commission”) filed its Complaint for civil penalties and other relief (“Complaint”) in this matter, pursuant to Sections 5(*l*) and 16(a)(1) of the Federal Trade Commission Act (“FTC Act”), 15 U.S.C. §§ 45(*l*) and 56(a)(1). Plaintiff and Defendants stipulate to entry of this Stipulated Final Judgment and Order for Permanent Injunction and Civil Penalty (“Stipulated Order”) to resolve all claims for civil penalties and injunctive relief known by the Commission prior to entry of this Stipulated Order.

THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED as follows:

**FINDINGS**

1. This Court has jurisdiction over this matter.
2. The Complaint charges that Defendants engaged in conduct that violated the Decision and Order issued by the Commission in a proceeding bearing Docket No. C-4641, *In the Matter of Seven & i Holdings Co., Ltd., and 7-Eleven, Inc., a corporation; and Sunoco LP*.
3. Defendants neither admit nor deny any of the allegations in the Complaint, except as specifically stated in this Stipulated Order. Only for purposes of this action, Defendants admit the facts necessary to establish jurisdiction.

4. Defendants waive any claim that they may have under the Equal Access to Justice Act, 28 U.S.C. § 2412, concerning the prosecution of this action through the date of this Stipulated Order, and agree to bear their own costs and attorney fees.

5. Defendants waive all rights to appeal or otherwise challenge or contest the validity of this Stipulated Order.

## **I. CIVIL PENALTY**

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

A. Judgment in the amount of \$4,500,000 is entered in favor of the Plaintiff against Defendants as a civil penalty pursuant to Section 5(l) of the FTC Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45(l).

B. Defendants shall pay the civil penalty by making payment to the Federal Trade Commission within 30 days of entry of this Stipulated Order by electronic funds transfer in accordance with instructions specified by a representative of Plaintiff.

C. In the event of a default in payment, interest at the rate of 18 percent per annum shall accrue thereon from the date of the default to the date of payment.

## **II. MODIFICATION OF DECISION AND ORDER**

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Defendants, and their successors and assigns, shall consent to:

A. Reopening of the proceeding in FTC Docket No. C-4641, *In the Matter of Seven & i Holdings Co., Ltd., and 7-Eleven, Inc., a corporation; and Sunoco LP* for the sole and limited purpose of modifying certain provisions as detailed below;

B. Waiving their rights under the show cause procedures set forth in Section 3.72(b) of the Commission's Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 3.72(b); and

C. Modifying Paragraph VII.A and Schedule A of the Decision and Order to include the retail fuel outlet located at 3100 54th Ave. S, Saint Petersburg, FL 33712 with the Oil Price Information Service (“OPIS”) ID 338038 (the “St. Petersburg Outlet”).

D. Modifying Paragraph VII.B and Nonpublic Schedule D of the Decision and Order to include the retail fuel outlet located at [REDACTED]  
[REDACTED] as a Relevant Notice Outlet.

E. Modifying Paragraph VII.B and Nonpublic Schedule D of the Decision and Order to remove the St. Petersburg Outlet.

### III. CONTINUING JURISDICTION

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Court retains jurisdiction of this matter for purposes of construction, modification, and enforcement of this Stipulated Order.




