RESOLUTION DIRECTING USE OF COMPULSORY PROCESS REGARDING ANY PERSONS, PARTNERSHIPS, AND CORPORATIONS SUBJECT TO PRIOR COMMISSION ORDERS

Nature and Scope of Investigation:

To investigate whether any persons, partnerships, or corporations who are subject to Federal Trade Commission administrative orders or Federal Trade Commission orders entered by federal courts: (1) have committed or are committing order violations; or (2) are engaging in unfair, deceptive, anticompetitive, collusive, coercive, predatory, exploitative, or exclusionary acts or practices in violation of Section 5 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. § 45, as amended, or any statutes or rules enforced by the Commission; and to determine the appropriate action or remedy, including whether monetary relief or order modifications would be in the public interest.

The Federal Trade Commission hereby resolves and directs that any and all compulsory processes available to it, including subpoenas and orders to file special reports, be used in connection with any inquiry within the nature and scope of this resolution for a period not to exceed ten years. The expiration of this ten-year period shall not limit or terminate the investigation or the legal effect of any compulsory process issued during the ten-year period. The Federal Trade Commission specifically authorizes the filing or continuation of actions to enforce any such compulsory process after the expiration of the ten-year period.

Authority to Conduct Investigation:

Sections 6, 9, 10, and 20 of the Federal Trade Commission Act, 15 U.S.C. §§ 46, 49, 50, and 57b-1, as amended; the FTC Procedures and Rules of Practice, 16 C.F.R. § 1.1 *et seq.*, and supplements thereto.
